Parent Email Messages

Allergy Sign

Babies & Toddlers Sessions: 1, 5, 11

Preschool Session: 5

Several exploration activities in the Leader Guide sessions include foods, plants, animals, or other nature items. Some children in your class may have allergies to these items. Whenever you plan to use nature items, inform parents ahead of time. Write the name of the nature item being used. Post the sign on the door for parents' attention.

Print several Allergy Signs to have on hand.

Be Brave Picture Cards

Babies & Toddlers Session: 9

Preschool Session: 9

Print these cards to use during Session 9 as you teach about Esther's bravery. Images show situations when children are afraid or hurt. Cut apart the picture cards and use them for talking about times when God will help us be brave.

Babies & Toddlers Leader Guide suggests that babies' teachers tape the pictures inside note cards. Babies will peek and see the pictures and hear about God's help and nearness. Toddlers' teachers will guide children to clip picture cards on a box as they hear the story about Esther.

Preschool Leader Guide suggests providing the picture cards for children to make a collage. Cards could also be used for matching.

Note: Be Brave Picture Cards might be a useful supplement to sessions related to the Daniel stories as well.

Bible Book Pages

Preschool Sessions: 1-13

This item features the names of six Bible books that will be explored during the Fall quarter. Preschool Leader Guide suggests using the pages for art activities to help children learn to recognize and say Bible book names.

Use Bible Book Pages during these sessions as desired: Romans (Sessions 1-3), Ephesians (Session 4), Daniel (Sessions 5-7), Esther (Sessions 8-9), Galatians (Sessions 10-11), and James (Sessions 12-13).

Esther Story Cards

Preschool Session: 9

Print these cards to use during Session 9. Teachers will give children turns to speak and answer questions related to the Bible story.

See Preschool Leader Guide for specific directions and conversation related to using the Story Cards.

Footprint Cutouts

Babies & Toddlers Session: 7

Walk on footprints, step up on a stool, then step down on more footprints. Teachers will relate this activity to Daniel's climbing the steps to his room to pray three times a day.

See Babies & Toddlers Leader Guide, Session 7, for specific guidance in using the footprints.

JESUS Letter Match

Babies & Toddlers Session: 4

Print one or more pages of the JESUS Letter Match to use with toddlers during Session 4. Teachers are encouraged to help children become familiar with Jesus' name and learn to recognize it in books, pictures, and the Bible.

Cut the page in half. One half should remain in one piece; the other half can be cut as indicated to create individual letters (J, E, S, U, S).

King's Fortress/Castle

Preschool Session: 8

Print this page to use as a sample guide for preschoolers during Session 8. An exploration activity suggests that children build a king's fortress using props such as wooden and foam blocks, shiny ribbon, cardboard cutouts.

See Preschool Leader Guide for suggestions for using the page to initiate building and lead to conversation about Esther's going to live at the king's castle.

Letter A Page

Babies & Toddlers Session: 2

This page is suggested for use with toddlers during Session 2. While teachers talk about Paul's letter to churches and his reminder for the people to be like Abraham, toddlers can decorate large letter As with crayons, markers, stickers, or paints.

Live Like Jesus Cards

Babies & Toddlers Session: 4

Preschool Session: 10

Print and cut apart these cards to use with toddlers and preschoolers. During Session 4, toddlers will stack cardboard blocks on which the cards are taped. During Session 10, preschoolers will use the cards to make a poster. Each child will glue a card to a piece of paper, then draw a picture on the paper that relates to the statement on the card. When all preschoolers have decorated a paper, children will tape the papers side by side on a wall to make a banner.

CIRCLE TIME

GATHER

- Place today's Bible Verse Marker (Pack Item 16) at Romans 1. Carry the Bible and Story Picture (Pack Item 1) as you walk through the room. Give each child a toy people figure to take to the circle area.
- Place the Bible on the floor. Tell toddlers to stand their people figures around the Bible.
- Say: "Thank you. Now let's hear a story from the Bible."

HEAR THE BIBLE STORY

- Get the Bible from the floor and open it to Romans 1. Place the Bible in your lap.
- Hold the Story Picture for toddlers to see. Tell the Bible story in your own words.
- After the story, ask: "Who wrote a letter? Was it Paul? Yes. Paul wrote to church friends."
- Pick up a people figure and comment: "Paul said that the good news is for everyone. God sent Jesus to help all people."

 Picture-read the Book: The Good News Is for Everyone (Pack Item 19).

PRACTICE BIBLE SKILLS

- Call on a toddler to stand near you.
 Help the child open the Bible to the marker.
- Say the Bible verse, then lead toddlers to say the verse.
- Sing this song (tune "Mary Had a Little Lamb"):

 The good news is for everyone, everyone, everyone. The good news is for everyone, the good news is for (child's name).
- Sing about every toddler at church.

- Thank God for sending Jesus for all people.
- Ask God to help us be ready to share the good news of Jesus with all people.



DRIVE TOY VEHICLES

Tools: Bible, Story Picture: Paul's Good News (Pack Item 1), Blocks Play Mat (Pack Item 17), toy vehicles

- Lay the Blocks Play Mat on a low table with the roads side facing up. Arrange the toy vehicles around the play mat.
- Invite a few toddlers to drive toy vehicles on the roads. While children play, ask them to tell where they are going in their toy vehicles. Suggest driving to church.
- Point to the Story Picture. Say: "Paul talked to people and taught them about Jesus. Paul said that God sent Jesus to help all people."
- Thank God for sending Jesus.

CALL FRIENDS

Tools: Bible, 2 toy phones and 2 old cell phones (batteries removed), Book: The Good News Is for Everyone (Pack Item 19)

- Picture-read the book to a few children.
 Talk about the good news: God sent Jesus to help people. Jesus came for everyone!
- Encourage toddlers to choose phones to make calls to friends.
- Say: "You may call someone and tell him the good news. Tell your friend that Jesus came to help him and everyone."
- Encourage toddlers to make pretend calls to friends, siblings, or parents and tell them that God sent Jesus for all people.

PUT TOGETHER PUZZLES

Tools: Bible, Diaper Bag Card, scissors, 2 or 3 wooden puzzles featuring people, church, or alphabet letters

- Use the scissors to cut the Diaper Bag Card into 3 or 4 pieces (depending on the age of your children). Lay the pieces on top of the Bible and arrange the wooden puzzles around the table.
- Encourage a toddler to choose a puzzle to put together. When a child puts the Diaper Bag Card pieces together, talk about Paul.
- Say: "Paul wrote a letter to church people. Paul reminded the people to know and worship Jesus. Paul said that the good news about Jesus is for everyone."
- Relate the other puzzles to today's emphasis. Tell children that God loves everyone, and He wants all people to know and love Jesus.

- Make a final diaper check.
- Put a Diaper Bag Card and Preschool Family Card in each child's bag.
- Release children to authorized adults.

CIRCLE TIME

GATHER

- Lay the Bible, today's Verse Marker (Pack Item 16), and the Story Picture (Pack Item 2) on the floor in the Circle Time area.
- Play music and invite children to dance their way to Circle Time.
- As children arrive, help them line up in order of height: shortest to tallest.
- Comment: "You look like one big family of children. Today we are going to hear about someone who had faith in God and was promised a large family and many children."
- Direct children to be seated.

- Remark: "Today's Bible verse is from the letter Paul wrote to church people. Let's say the words together."
- Point to your heart while guiding toddlers to say the verse.
- Listen to the song "I'm Happy 'Cause God Loves Me" (track 5).

HEAR THE BIBLE STORY

- Open the Bible to Romans 4 and lay the Bible in your lap.
- Show the Story Picture as you tell the Bible story in your own words.
- After the story, ask a few questions to help toddlers recall the story: Who wanted people to know about God's love? (Paul)

- Say a prayer asking God to help you and the children have faith like Abraham.
- Pray for children to believe that God loves people and keeps His promises to them.



CARE FOR BABY DOLLS

Tools: Bible, Diaper Bag Card, 2 plastic baby dolls, doll care accessories, doll diaper bag

- Lay the dolls and accessories where preschoolers will notice them.
- Invite a toddler to care for a doll. Talk about things the child's family does to care for him.
- Show the toddler the picture on the Diaper Bag Card. Say: "When Abraham was old, God promised to give a baby to Abraham and his wife. Abraham believed God's promise."
- As the child plays, comment that God's love is in our hearts when we believe in Him and trust His promises.

COUNT THE PEOPLE

Tools: Bible, Story Picture: Paul Told About Abraham (Pack Item 2), People Cards (Pack Item 20), cardboard blocks

- Give toddlers space to build with blocks and create towers and walking paths.
 Encourage safety in the children's play.
- Show toddlers the People Cards. Lead children to count the number of people in each picture. Remark that God made people, and He loves them.
- After counting people, show children the Story Picture. Recall that God promised to give Abraham more children than stars in the sky. Say: "Abraham believed God."
- Remind children that Paul's letter to friends in Rome told about Abraham.

LACE HEART SHAPES

Tools: Bible, solid-red place mat, craft knife or utility scissors, pen, permanent marker, hole punch, shoelaces

- Use the pen to outline three large heart shapes on the place mat, then use the craft knife to cut out the shapes.
- Use the permanent marker to write today's Text Truth on each heart cutout. Punch holes an inch apart in the perimeter and tie a shoelace through one hole.
- Put the heart shapes near the Bible.
- Invite a toddler to tell you the name of the shape (heart). Say: "Hearts remind me of love. Paul told people to love God and believe Him."
- Guide the child to thread the shoelace around the heart.

- Make a final diaper check.
- Put a Diaper Bag Card and Preschool Family Card in each child's bag.
- Release children to authorized adults.

☆ CIRCLE TIME

GATHER

- Put the Bible, Story Picture (Pack Item 3), a large heart shape, and today's Bible Verse Marker (Pack Item 16) in a basket.
- Play music and lead toddlers to follow you to Circle Time. Carry the basket with you.
- When toddlers are seated, put the basket in your lap.
- Ask preschoolers to guess what is in the basket. Take out the heart shape and say: "This is a heart. It reminds me of something important Paul told people. Listen to hear what Paul said."

PRACTICE BIBLE SKILLS

- Call on one toddler to get the final item from the basket: today's Verse Marker.
- While the child holds the marker. lead the group to say the Bible verse and reference together.

PRAY

- Say a simple prayer to thank God for loving us and for sending Jesus.
- · Thank God for Paul's letter that reminds us that God is always with us.

HEAR THE BIBLE STORY

- Set the basket to the side and get the Bible. Open it to Romans 8.
- Tell the Bible story in your words, then pass the Story Picture around the circle.
- Say: "Paul talked about love, didn't he? Paul said that nothing can keep God's love from us. That is such good news to know."



MOVE TO MUSIC

Tools: Bible, Music & Print Extras, Story Picture: A Reminder of God's Love (Pack Item 3)

- Play music and hold the Bible as you move around the room to the beat of the music. Invite toddlers to join you.
- Say: "When I hold up the Bible, stop moving."
- Between songs, summarize the Bible story. Show toddlers the Story Picture and point to the people. Say: "Paul told the people about God's love."
- Continue playing as long as children are interested.

MATCH POSTCARD PUZZLES

Tools: Bible, Diaper Bag Card, 3 or 4 postcards, scissors, paper bag

- Cut the postcards in half and place them in a bag with the Diaper Bag Card.
- Shake the bag to get a child's attention.
 Invite the child to find picture halves that go together. Give hints if necessary.
- As the child completes the pictures, remark: "People travel to many places to tell about Jesus. Paul traveled to towns to teach people, but Paul also wrote letters. One of those letters is called *Romans*. Paul's letter is in the Bible."
- Turn to the book of Romans and point to Paul's name. Say: "Paul told people about God's love"

MATCH BIBLES TO OUTLINES

Tools: 3 or 4 Bibles of different sizes, poster board, marker

- Before the session, arrange the Bibles on the poster board and draw around them to make outlines.
- Invite a toddler to examine the Bibles. Talk about the differences and similarities among the Bibles. Comment that all of the Bibles tell about God and Jesus.
- Guide the toddler to match the Bibles by size to their outlines.
- Say: "The Bible tells about God. Words in the Bible tell us that God loves people and is always with them. Nothing can keep God from loving us."
- Help the toddler turn to Romans 8:39 in a Bible. Say the words of the Bible verse, then help the toddler say the verse words.

- Make a final diaper check.
- Put a Diaper Bag Card and Preschool Family Card in each child's bag.
- Release children to authorized adults.

CIRCLE TIME

GATHER

- Play music to signal Circle Time.
- Invite toddlers to line up behind you, then follow you around the room to the Circle Time area.
- Direct children to stand and imitate your actions: tap your head, stand on one foot, wave your arms like wings, and so forth.
 Finally, ask preschoolers to be seated.

HEAR THE BIBLE STORY

- Hold up the Story Picture (Pack Item 4) and ask children if they remember the name of the man in the picture.
- Remark: "This is Paul. We read about Paul in the Bible. Let's listen to a story about Paul."
- Tell the story in your own words.
- Say: "Paul wrote many letters to friends and churches. Paul wanted to help people learn to be like Jesus."

PRACTICE BIBLE SKILLS

- Show the mirror to the children.
 Tell toddlers to pass the mirror around the circle.
- As each child receives the mirror, tell him to look in the mirror and repeat the statement "Be like Jesus."
- After everyone has a turn, put away the mirror and picture-read the book.

- Pray for toddlers to learn how to live like Jesus.
- Ask God to be with teachers and encourage them in their important role of guiding children to learn about Jesus.



READ BOOKS ABOUT JESUS

Tools: Bible, Book: The Good News Is for Everyone (Pack Item 19), 2 or 3 other books about Jesus, 2 small pillows, Diaper Bag Card

- Prop the pillows against the wall in a corner of the room. Place the Bible, Story Picture, and the books near the pillows.
- Invite one or two children to sit and read. After helping children get comfortable, picture-read a book. Relate the book's message and visuals to today's emphasis on being like Jesus.
- Tap the Diaper Bag Card and say: "Paul wrote a letter to church friends. Paul reminded the people to live like Jesus and do the things Jesus did."

"WRITE" MESSAGES

Tools: Bible, Story Picture: Paul Encouraged Church Friends (Pack Item 4), business envelopes, half sheets of manila paper, happy face stickers, washable markers or crayons

- Invite toddlers to scribble messages on paper and put them in the envelopes.
 Children can decorate the envelopes with the stickers.
- Name ways people send messages: call, send letters, email, text.
- Show children the Story Picture and recall that Paul wrote a letter to church friends. Paul wrote on papyrus paper and may have used a quill pen.
- Say: "Paul told the church friends to be like Jesus." Recall the Bible story.

HOP UP A TAPE LADDER

Tools: Bible, 4 large paper plates, washable marker, wide masking tape

- Write each word of the Bible verse on a separate paper plate.
 Write the verse reference on the fourth plate.
- Use the tape to make a "ladder" on the floor with four sections. Lay one plate beside each section. (Place the plates in reverse word order.)
- Invite a toddler to hop up the ladder. As the child hops, read the word on the adjacent paper plate. At the "top" of the ladder, say the full Bible verse.
- Say: "Good work! You hopped to the top. Now let's say the words without hopping."
- Lead the toddler to say the Bible verse with you.

- Make a final diaper check.
- Put a Diaper Bag Card and Preschool Family Card in each child's bag.
- Release children to authorized adults.

CIRCLE TIME

GATHER

- Open the Bible to Daniel 1. Lay the Bible with the Story Picture (Pack Item 5), today's Bible Verse Marker (Pack Item 16), and the Action Cube (Pack Item 24) in the Circle Time area.
- Invite toddlers to join you in Circle Time. Roll the cube several times and guide children to do the actions.
- Direct preschoolers to be seated.

HEAR THE BIBLE STORY

- Hold the Bible on your lap. Say: "Our story is from the book of Daniel."
- Tell the Bible story to the children.
- When the story is finished, ask a few review questions:
 What did the king order for the young men to eat? (rich foods)
 Whose laws about eating did Daniel obey? (God's)
 What did Daniel eat rather than the king's food? (fresh vegetables and water)

Who was pleased with Daniel's choice to obey? (*God*)

PRACTICE BIBLE SKILLS

- Invite a child to get the Verse Marker from the floor and give it to you. Say to the children: "Today's Bible verse is from a different Bible book, the book of 1 Kings."
- Read the Bible verse from the marker, then turn to 1 Kings 2:3a in the Bible. Show preschoolers the verse on the page.
- Lead the group to say the Bible verse together.
- Ask: "Whose commands should we obey? God's!"

PRAY

• Ask God to help you and the toddlers love and obey God.



RECORD VOICES

Tools: Bible, Bible Verse Markers (Pack Item 16), smartphone, Diaper Bag Card, paper bag

- Put the Diaper Bag Card and the Bible in the bag.
- Ask a toddler to remove an item. Read the Bible verse or summarize the Bible story for the child.
- Say: "Today we've heard about a choice Daniel made. Daniel chose to obey God. Our Bible verse says to obey God's commands. Let's say our verse."
- Lead one or two children to say the verse as you record them on the phone. Play back the recording for children to hear.

FIND & TRANSPORT BIBLES

Tools: several Bibles, teacher's Bible, child's wagon, Story Picture: Daniel Chose to Obey (Pack Item 5)

- Place the Bibles around the room in view of toddlers. Put the Story Picture in the wagon.
- Show your Bible to a child. Say: "I brought my Bible to church. We have Bibles in our room. Can you find more Bibles and put them in the wagon?"
- Direct the child to collect the Bibles and take them to one location. Sit down together and look at the Bibles.
- Ask the child to hold the Bible open to Daniel 1 while you recall the Bible story about Daniel's decision to obey God.

WALK ON A BUMPY "ROAD"

Tools: Bible, large piece of bubble wrap, clear contact plastic, wide packing tape, Preschool Family Card

- Make a "road" on the floor using the bubble wrap and contact plastic. Tape the plastics to the floor securely. (Do not allow toddlers to pull up the plastics.)
- Invite a child to walk on the path. Mention the sound of socks or shoes pulling away from the sticky plastic. Or step on a bubble to pop it. Talk about the sounds.
- Say: "You have fun walking on the bumpy road. Daniel and many other people from Jerusalem walked to a new country.
 Some of the roads were probably bumpy. Daniel and his friends had to learn many new things in the new country. But they always obeyed God's commands."

- Make a final diaper check.
- Put a Diaper Bag Card and Preschool Family Card in each child's bag.
- Release children to authorized adults.

GATHER

- Ring some jingle bells and invite toddlers to join you in the Circle Time area. As children arrive, give each child a turn to ring the bells.
- Show the Story Picture (Pack Item
 6) to toddlers and remark: "Today's
 Bible story is about three men who made a choice to worship God and not a statue. Listen to the story."

HEAR THE BIBLE STORY

- Hold the Bible in front of toddlers and point to Daniel 3 on the Bible page. Say: "This is where we read about the three friends."
- Tell the story in your own words, then ask these review questions: What did the king build? (a very tall statue)

What were the people commanded to do when they heard instruments play? (bow down to the ground in front of the statue)
Did Daniel's three friends worship the statue? (no)

Who helped Daniel's friends stay safe from the fire? (*God*)

PRACTICE BIBLE SKILLS

- Hold up today's Verse Marker (Pack Item 16) and read the verse aloud.
- Say: "God kept Daniel's friends safe, and the king was surprised. The king learned that God is the one true God."
- Play the song "God, the One and Only" (track 3) and lead children to clap softly as the music plays.
- After the song, invite toddlers to say the Bible verse a few times.

- Pray, thanking God for His greatness and power.
- Ask God to help children remember that there is no other God.



LACE A PICTURE CARD

Tools: Bible, Diaper Bag Card, hole punch, long shoelace, shape sorter toy

- Punch holes around the Diaper Bag Card and tie the shoelace through a hole and knot it.
- Place the lacing card with the shape sorter toy. Open the Bible to Daniel 3.
- Invite a toddler to lace the picture card or put shapes in the sorter. While the child is busy, read the Text Truth printed on the card.
- Remark: "Daniel's friends loved God and obeyed Him. When the king told the friends to worship a statue and not God, the men chose to worship only God."

HEAR & IDENTIFY SOUNDS

Tools: Bible; Preschool Family Card; ticking clock, kitchen timer, music box, wind chimes, bell, or other items that make sounds; small towel

- Put the items on the towel. Invite curious toddlers to sit in front of you and listen to some items that make sounds.
- Move or shake items to create their sounds. Help toddlers identify the items and ask if the sounds are soft or loud.
- Show children the picture on the Family Card. Say: "You heard the items make sound. A king told people to bow down in front of a statue when they heard instruments playing."
- Recall the Bible story with children.

MATCH COLORS & LETTERS

Tools: Bible, Story Picture: Three Friends Stood Up (Pack Item 6), 3 colors of paper, washable markers, scissors

- Cut six squares from the paper (two squares of each color).
 Write the letters of God's name on matching colors of paper. For example, write the letter G on two yellow squares, the letter O on two blue squares, and the letter D on two red squares.
- Lay one set of squares on a table in order to spell the name *God*. Place the other set of squares on the Story Picture.
- Say to a child: "See the letters on the squares. They spell God's name. *G-O-D*. Can you find other colored squares that are the same?"
- As the child matches colors and letters, recall the Bible story.
 Say: "God is the only God."

- Make a final diaper check.
- Put a Diaper Bag Card and Preschool Family Card in each child's bag.
- Release children to authorized adults.

CIRCLE TIME

GATHER

- Shake a musical instrument as you walk around the room to get toddlers' attention. Lead children to the Circle Time area.
- Lead toddlers in a game. Tell children to do things to get ready for bed (brush teeth, read a book, say a prayer).
- Remark: "People often pray at bedtime. Our Bible story is about someone who prayed in the morning, in the middle of the day, and again at nighttime."

HEAR THE BIBLE STORY

- Hold the Bible in your lap and open it to Daniel 6.
- Tell the Bible story in your words.
- Ask the children several review questions:

Who told the people they could not pray to God? (the king)
What did Daniel choose to do? (He prayed to God anyway.)
How often did Daniel pray to God? (three times a day)

Who kept Daniel safe? (God)

Pass the Story Picture (Pack Item
7) around the circle so children can view it.

PRACTICE BIBLE SKILLS

- Say: "Daniel chose to obey God and worship only Him. Daniel knew that no matter what the king did to punish Daniel, God would be with Daniel."
- Play the song "God Is With Me Always" (track 2).
- Ask children to stand and say the Bible verse together. Say: "Daniel knew God was with him."

- Thank God for helping us. Ask God to show us how to love Him more and obey Him even when it is hard to do.
- Thank God for the Bible and its truths.



SCOOP & DROP COTTON BALLS

Tools: Bible, 6-cup muffin pan, 3 paper baking cups, marker, cotton balls, plastic spoon

- Write a word in the bottom of each paper cup: *God*, *helps*, *us*. Put the paper cups in one row of the muffin pan. Put the cotton balls and spoon next to the pan.
- When a toddler shows interest, point to the paper cups and read the words. Say: "We learn from today's story about Daniel that God helps us." Recall the Bible story briefly.
- Invite the toddler to use the spoon to scoop cotton balls and drop them into the paper cups. Say the Text Truth several times as the child fills paper cups.

MOVE TO TAPE SHAPES

Tools: Bible, Diaper Bag Card, colored tape

- Use tape to create a variety of large shapes on the floor. Place the Diaper Bag Card in a shape.
- Guide toddlers to crawl to a square, hop to a triangle, tiptoe to a circle, or jump to a line.
- When children move to the shape with the Diaper Bag Card, stop to look at the picture. Say: "This is Daniel. Daniel kept on praying to God even when the king said to stop."
- Direct toddlers as they move to the shapes. Stop after a few minutes to open the Bible to Daniel 6 and summarize the Bible story.

MAKE A WALL DRAWING

Tools: Bible, Story Picture: Daniel Stayed Strong, long sheet of paper, tape, crayons or markers

- Tape the paper to the wall at toddlers' eye level. Write today's Bible verse across the paper. Put the Story Picture and Bible in a chair near the paper.
- Invite a child to begin drawing. As she scribbles on the paper, read the printed words. Say: "When the king saw that Daniel was not hurt when he stayed in the lions' cave, the king knew that God rescued Daniel. We know that God helps us and saves us."
- Invite another child to draw. Show the children the Story Picture and recall the Bible story. Say: "Daniel prayed to God even though the king said not to. Daniel prayed all day long."
- Show the children Daniel's name in the Bible.

- Make a final diaper check.

- Ask children to stand and say the Bible verse with you.
- Play the song "God Is With Me Always" (track 2) as you lead children to walk in a circle.

WORK PUZZLES

- Put each puzzle's pieces in a separate bag.
 Put the bags near the Bible opened to Esther 1.
- Invite a child to choose a bag and empty it. Say: "Look. I see puzzle pieces. Can you work the puzzle and tell me what you see?"
- As children work puzzles, relate pictures and objects to today's Bible story or verse.
- Show the picture on the Diaper Bag Card and remind children that God was with Esther, and He is with us.

STICK PICTURES ON PLASTIC

Tools: Bible, clear contact plastic, strong tape, picture cutouts showing locations, strip of paper, marker

- Cut a long strip of plastic and tape it to the wall at toddlers' eye level. The sticky side should face outward.
- On the paper strip, write: *Places God Is With Me*. Put the strip on the plastic.
- Invite children to look for pictures of places they go. Places may include home, church, park, doctor's office, restaurant, zoo, car, and grocery. Direct children to put the pictures on the plastic.
- Say: "God is with you wherever you go."
- Summarize today's Bible story.

GUESS THE "KING" OR "QUEEN"

Tools: Bible, Story Picture: A New Queen (Pack Item 8), toy crown

- Seat several children in a group. Say: "Let's play a game. I am looking for a king or queen. Listen to see who it will be."
- Describe a child in the group and ask friends to identify the child. Say something like: "This person has on a blue dress and black shoes. Who is it?"
- When toddlers guess correctly, call the child to you and put the crown on his or her head. Say: "You can be our queen (king)."
- Play until every child has a turn to be king or queen.
- Show toddlers the Story Picture and comment that the king looked for a new queen, and he chose Esther. Turn to Esther 1 in the Bible and summarize the Bible story.

- Ask preschoolers to get their craft sticks showing Jesus, then stand.
- Say today's Bible verse together a few more times.

HEAR THE BIBLE STORY

- Say: "I love that song. It helps me know that I am special to Jesus.
 Paul wrote a letter to some church friends. Paul said, 'Jesus loves me.'
 Let's listen to the story to learn more about what Paul wrote."
- Tell the Bible story in your own words, then pass the Story Picture (Pack Item 10) around the circle.

PRAY

- Remark: "I'm so glad God gave us the Bible to learn about Jesus and the things He taught. We can do the things Jesus said to do."

PLAY WITH CARS & PEOPLE

Tools: Bible, toy people figures, toy cars, Blocks Play Mat (Pack Item 17), Diaper Bag Card

- Place toy cars and people figures near the play mat on the floor.
- Hold a people figure and suggest the figure is on his way to church. Encourage a toddler to drive a toy car to church.
- As children play, say: "You have friends at church. Your friends love you. Paul wrote a letter to church friends because he loved them. Paul told the friends to do the things Jesus said to do."
- Turn to Galatians 2 in the Bible and summarize today's Bible story. Show the picture of Paul on the Diaper Bag Card.

DECORATE JESUS' NAME

Tools: Bible, copy paper, colored office dot stickers, marker, crayons

- Use the marker to write the letters *J,E,S,U,S* on separate dot stickers. Make a set of letters for each child.
- Give a child a paper and set of letter dots. Encourage the child to place his stickers anywhere on the paper. Say: "Those letters spell Jesus' name. We love Jesus. We can learn to do the things Jesus said to do."
- Show the child Jesus' name in the book of Galatians.
- Offer crayons to the toddler to draw on his Jesus paper.

MATCH LETTERS & READ

Tools: Bible, Book: The Good News Is For Everyone (Pack Item 19), JESUS Letter Match (Music & Print Extras), Story Picture: People Learned Who to Obey (Pack Item 10)

- Print the JESUS Letter Match page and cut apart one set of letters. Put the Letter Match near the Bible open to Galatians 2.
- Show a toddler the Story Picture and remark that Paul wrote letters to church people to help them know about Jesus. Say: "One time Paul wrote a letter to tell people to do the things Jesus said to do." Recall more of the Bible story.
- Show the child the paper showing Jesus' name. Say: "I see some letters that spell Jesus' name. Can you match the letters?" Guide the toddler as needed to match letter cutouts to the name Jesus.
- Read the book to children and talk about things Jesus did.

- Make a final diaper check.
- Put a Diaper Bag Card and Preschool Family Card in each child's bag.
- Release children to authorized adults.

- Hold the Story Picture (Pack Item 11) and point to Paul. Say: "Paul cared about the people in the church in Galatia. He talked to them about Jesus and the right things to do."
- Point to items on the floor and help children think of a way the items can be used to serve others.

- Show today's Verse Marker (Pack Item 16) and read the words.
- Say: "These words are from the letter Paul wrote to his church friends. The words are in the Bible for us to read and remember."
- Turn to Galatians 6:10 and move your finger over the words.
- Help children say the Bible verse.

- Thank God for your church and people who serve others.
- Ask God to help you serve others better.



WORK PUZZLES & ARRANGE CUPS

Tools: Bible, 2 or 3 simple helpers puzzles, 5 paper cups, washable markers

- Turn the cups upside down. Print one word of the Text Truth on the side of each cup. Number the tops of the cups. Mix up the cups and place them with the helper puzzles.
- Talk about puzzle pictures as toddlers work puzzles. Mention ways people appear to be serving one another in love.

DRAW WITH CRAYON BUNDLES

- Invite toddlers to work together to clean the classroom. Tell children they are doing what Paul told his church friends to do—work together and help others.
- Show toddlers the Story Picture and recall the Bible story. Remark: "Paul wrote a letter to his church friends to remind them what they should do."

- Lead toddlers to say the Bible verse with you.

- Pray, asking God to help you love others and live like Jesus.
- Ask God to help children learn and do what the Bible teaches.



LISTEN & DO

Tools: Bible, 1 sheet of green paper, 1 sheet of red paper

- Show toddlers the two colors of paper.
 Explain about traffic lights (red color means stop; green color means go).
- Say: "When I hold up the green paper, move. When you see the red paper, stop moving."
- Give directions such as walk to a window, crawl around a chair, or turn in a circle.
- Say: "You listened well to the directions and did what I said. A verse in the Bible says to hear what the Bible says, but also do what the Bible says." Say the Bible verse together.

STAMP LETTERS IN DOUGH

Tools: Bible, fresh play dough, play dough letter stampers, small rolling pins

- Though toddlers are not reading yet, they are beginning to recognize some letters.
 Give children some fresh dough and a few letter stampers to use. Letters might include B (for Bible), L (for learn), J (for James and Jesus), D (for do).
- While children play with the dough, relate the letters to today's Bible story and Text Truth. For instance, say: "That is the letter J. James' name begins with J, and Jesus' name begins with J. James wrote a letter to tell people about Jesus."
- Help toddlers look for words and letters in the Bible.

MAKE SCROLLS

Tools: Bible, Diaper Bag Card, copy paper, crayons, marker, 12-inch pieces of yarn or ribbon

- Write today's Bible verse on each paper, then give a paper and some crayons to each child. Suggest that preschoolers draw whatever they choose. While children draw, read the Bible verse words to them.
- Show children the Diaper Bag Card and mention the scroll in James' arms. Ask toddlers if anyone remembers what James wrote in the scroll. Recall the Bible story for the children.
- After a child finishes drawing, show him how to roll the paper to make a scroll. Ask the child to hold the scroll while you tie yarn around it.

- Make a final diaper check.
- Put a Diaper Bag Card and Preschool Family Card in each child's bag.
- Release children to authorized adults.

MAKE A PRAYER PICTURE

Tools: Bible; paper plates; pictures of people, food, animals, clothes; glue sticks; Preschool Family Card

- Give a paper plate, a few pictures, and a glue stick to each child.
- Say: "When people pray, they talk to God. They thank God for providing for them, and they ask God to help them. The people tell God they love Him."
- Show a child a picture. Suggest that the picture shows something God provides for the child, and it is something for which the child can thank God.
- As the child makes his picture, show the picture on the Family Card. Point to the people praying. Recall the Bible story.

- Give each child some craft sticks and paper circles.
 Suggest that the children draw faces on the circles, then attach them to craft sticks.
- Say the Text Truth as preschoolers move or wave their puppet faces.

DRIVE PLACES

Tools: Bible, paper strip marking Romans 1:16, classroom chairs, set of keys, map, sunglasses, tote bag, Activity Page

- Put the items in the tote bag. Arrange four chairs to resemble a car, and lay the bag in the "front seat."
- Invite two or three children to get in the "car" and drive somewhere. Tell them to look in the bag for some things they might need.
- When the "car" arrives at a destination, ask a child to show his friends the picture on the Activity Page.
 Remark that Paul went to many places to teach people about Jesus.
- Ask a child to open the Bible to the marked verse. Say the words that Paul wrote in his letter to the people living in Rome.

PLAY GOOD NEWS TAG

Tools: Bible, square sticky notes, marker

- Print the statement *Jesus loves you!* on sticky notes, making two notes per child. Give each child her two notes.
- Open the Bible to Romans 1. Say: "The book of Romans is a letter written by Paul to the churches in Rome. In this letter, Paul tells the people that God sent Jesus for all people, no matter who they are or where they are from. Paul wanted to share the good news of Jesus with everyone."
- Invite children to play a game of tag. Tell boys and girls the goal is to stick their two notes on other children.
- Tell children to say the statement "Jesus loves you!" whenever they successfully stick a note on a friend. When a child is tagged with a sticky note, he can then stick the note on another friend.

MOVE CARS ON ROADS

Tools: Bible; masking tape; toy cars, trucks, boat; toy road signs (optional)

- Create masking tape roadways on the floor. Put the cars near the roads.
- While preschoolers drive the vehicles, talk about Paul traveling to many cities and countries to tell the good news about Jesus. Say: "Paul wanted people to know that God sent Jesus to help them. Sometimes Paul walked, and sometimes he rode in boats."
- Open the Bible to Romans 1 and continue: "When Paul was unable to travel to cities, he sometimes wrote letters to people. Paul's letters are in the Bible."
- Summarize the Bible story while children continue to drive the vehicles.

MAKE & COUNT STARS

Tools: Bible, fresh play dough, play dough tools, star-shaped cookie cutters

- Show children the star-shaped cookie cutters. Say: "Stars remind me of God's promise to Abraham. Do you remember that promise?" (God would give Abraham more children than stars in the sky.) Continue: "Paul wrote about that promise."
- Show preschoolers the mention of Abraham in Romans 4. Tap Abraham's name on the page.
- Invite a few children at a time to make play dough stars. After a few minutes, guide children to count the stars.
- Open the Bible to Romans 5:1. Read the verse as you remind children that we can have faith in Jesus.

HOP TO THE BIBLE

Tools: Bible, masking tape, Activity Page

- Place the Activity Page in the Bible at Romans 4.
- Make a hopscotch grid on the floor. Make the sections larger than a child's foot. Show a child how to hop on one foot, two feet, one foot, and so on. At each step, say a letter in the word *Bible*.
- After a child completes her turn, tell her to get the Bible. Ask her to open it to the Activity Page at Romans 4.
- Say: "This part of the New Testament is Romans.
 This is a letter that Paul wrote to church people. Paul
 reminded the people about Abraham, someone who
 lived during Old Testament times."
- Show the child the picture of Abraham and summarize the Bible story.
- Give other children turns to hop to the Bible.

REVEAL A PICTURE

Tools: Bible, Story Picture: Paul Told About Abraham (Pack Item 2), pad of sticky notes

- Cover the entire Story Picture with the sticky notes.
- Invite children to remove sticky notes one at a time and tell something about the picture.

 Thank God for always being with us, no matter where we go or what we do. Thank God for His unending love for each of us.

REVIEW THE BIBLE STORY

- Say: "Today's story is from the book of Romans. Paul wanted to encourage people to remember that God is always with them."
- Show children the Story Picture (Pack Item 3) and ask children to tell what they remember about the story.

WRAP UP

 Form groups of two or three preschoolers and a teacher. Look at the Activity Page, review the Bible story, and say the Bible verse.



WALK TO THE MUSIC

Tools: Bible, masking tape, Activity Page

- Make a large masking tape circle on the floor. At one point on the edge of the circle, make a large *X*. Put the Bible and Activity Page in the center of the circle.
- Tell children to walk in a circle as you sing (tune "London Bridge"):
 Do you know who God is with, God is with?
- At the end of the song, tell the child standing on the *X* to move to the center and hold the Bible.

Do you know who God is with? God is always with people.

- Repeat the song and change directions. This time at the end of the song, tell the child standing on the *X* to exchange places with the first child.
- Ask the second child to show the Activity Page and point to the people.

TOSS A CUBE & MATCH COLORS

Tools: Bible, Color Cube (Pack Item 22), colored construction paper (should match colors of Color Cube), washable marker, scissors

- Cut the paper into long strips. Print the Text Truth and Bible verse on individual strips. Place the strips around the room.
- Invite a child to toss the cube and identify the color.
 Tell the child to find a paper strip that matches the color.
- Read the words to the child. Remark: "God is always with us, and nothing can keep us from God's love."
- Ask the child to return the strip to a different location in the room for other children to find later.

• Open the Bible to Romans 8:39 and point to the Bible verse. Help the child say the Bible verse with you.

SPELL THE BIBLE BOOK

Tools: Bible, Bible Book Markers (Pack Item 23), Activity Page, letter tiles to spell Romans, plastic bowl

- Put the Romans marker with the bowl of letters.
- Read the word on the marker for a child and call out the letters. Say: "The same letters are in the bowl. Can you match them to the ones on the marker? You will spell the name of a Bible book Paul wrote."
- When the child successfully creates the word *Romans*, help him locate the book in the Bible.
- Show the picture on the Activity Page and recall the Bible story. Say: "Paul told people that God is always with them."

CARE FOR BABY DOLLS

Tools: Bible, Story Picture: A Reminder of God's Love (Pack Item 3), 2 or 3 plastic baby dolls, baby doll items

- Lay the Story Picture next to the Bible.
- Point to the people in the picture and ask a child to tell what the people might be doing.
- Say: "Paul wrote a letter to the people in Rome. In the letter, Paul shared God's promise that He will always be with people. We are never alone."
- Invite children to care for the babies. Remind children that just as they take care of the babies, God will always take care of them.
- Say: "We do not have to worry or be afraid. God is always with us. Nothing can keep us from God's love. God will take care of us."

- Place the marker at Ephesians 5:19. Invite a child to open the Bible to the marker. Read the verse.
- Say: "Paul wrote a letter to the church people in Ephesus to help them know how to live like Jesus. In this verse, Paul told the people that they should give thanks to God and sing and worship Him."
- Invite preschoolers to play musical instruments and sing along with their favorite worship songs, just as Paul instructed the Ephesians to do.

PASS SCROLLS OVER & UNDER

Tools: Bible, 2 papers rolled up and tied like scrolls, 2 baskets

- Show the scrolls to preschoolers and remind them that people in Bible times often sent letters that were written on parchment and rolled up.
- Say: "Paul wrote his letter to the church people in Ephesus, then he gave the letter to someone to deliver to the people."
- Invite preschoolers to pass scrolls from one person to another. Form two teams of children and direct the children to stand in two lines. Put a basket at the end of each line.
- Instruct the first child in a line to pass the paper scroll over his head to the child behind him. Direct that child to pass the scroll behind his legs to the person behind him. Continue passing over and under until the scroll reaches the end of the line. Tell the child to place the scroll in the basket.

PLAY WITH PEOPLE FIGURES

Tools: Bible, 1 or 2 books about loving and helping, wooden blocks, toy dollhouse, plastic people figures, Story Picture: Paul Encouraged Church Friends (Pack Item 4)

- Children often play out their family activities.
 Observe children as they move the figures and pretend.
- Listen for opportunities to relate the children's play to today's emphasis on living like Jesus. Remark that Paul wrote to people in the church and encouraged them to help and love one another.
- Read a book, then help children consider ways they can work and help others.
- Show the Story Picture and recall Paul's letter to the Ephesian church.

MATCH CARDS & WORK PUZZLES

Tools: Bible, Letters of Paul Matching Cards (Pack Item 31), 2 or 3 puzzles related to helping and being kind

- Place the puzzles and cards on a table. Turn the puzzles facedown.
- Invite a child to choose a puzzle to work. Relate the pictures on the puzzles to today's focus on living like Jesus. Comment that Paul encouraged people to help and love one another.
- Encourage another child to match cards showing Bible books that are the letters of Paul. After matches are made, help the child locate the books in the New Testament part of the Bible.

- Open the Bible to 1 Kings 2:3. Read the verse aloud, then say: "This verse reminds us to obey God and do the things He tells us. That is what Daniel did. Daniel and his friends obeyed God's commands."
- Show preschoolers the letter O on a paper. Say: "God wants people to obey Him, just like Daniel and his friends did in our story today. Let's say our Text Truth together: Choose to obey God."
- Give each child a paper and dot markers or circle stickers. Say: "This page shows the letter O. That is the first letter in the word obey. We can choose to obey God just as Daniel did."
- While children decorate their papers, play the song "What God Wants Us to Do" (track 10).

WALK & FREEZE

Tools: Bible, Activity Page, upbeat music (familiar to preschoolers)

- Place the Activity Page at 1 Kings 2:3 in the Bible.
 Read the Bible verse and guide children to repeat the verse.
- Invite children to form a large circle. Play music as children walk in a circular direction. Encourage preschoolers to sing or hum as they walk.
- Pause the music. Instruct children to freeze in place until the music starts again. Continue playing as time allows.
- Say: "Just as you walked around and listened to my directions to freeze when the music stopped, our Bible verse tells us to obey the instructions God gives to us. Let's say our verse again."

PREPARE A MEAL

Tools: Bible, Story Picture: Daniel Chose to Obey (Pack Item 5), play kitchen items, play food items or picture cutouts showing foods, food trays

- Show the Story Picture to preschoolers. Recall: "Daniel and his friends were given the king's rich food to eat. Eating this food would cause the men to disobey God's laws. Daniel had an important choice to make. Do you remember the choice Daniel made? He and his friends chose to eat vegetables and drink water rather than eat the king's rich food."
- Talk to children about foods they enjoy. Invite the preschoolers to prepare a meal using pretend food and kitchen items.
- Join in the pretend meal and thank God for providing food and water and everything we need.

PASS THE PICTURE

Tools: Bible, Story Picture: Three Friends Stood Up (Pack Item 6)

- Direct preschoolers to stand in a circle.
- Pass the Story Picture around the circle. Say: "Freeze!"
 Tell the child holding the Story Picture to answer a
 question about the story. Call on friends to help the
 child give an answer. Continue so every child gets to
 speak.
- Ask questions such as: "What did the king make?
 What did the man tell people to do when they heard
 instruments being played? What did Daniel's friends

MOVE MAGNETS

Tools: Bible, October Verse Markers (Pack Item 29), scissors, self-adhesive magnetic tape, shape magnets, large magnetic board, Activity Page

- Cut today's Verse Marker in half. Attach a short piece of magnetic tape to the back of each piece. Put the verse pieces with the shape magnets.
- Lay the Activity Page in the Bible opened to Daniel 3.
- Invite a child to make a shape design on the board. Suggest that the child put the Bible verse pieces together. Read the words of the Bible verse.
- Say: "That is what the king said after Daniel's friends were saved from the fire. The king knew that only God could save the men."
- Show the picture on the Activity Page and recall the Bible story.

- Use the marker to print the Bible verse and reference on each plate. Open the Bible to Daniel 3:29.
- Read the words on a plate to a child. Comment that this verse is in the Bible. Show the preschooler the words.
- Invite the child to decorate the plate. Help her say the Bible verse with you a few times.
- Play the song "God, the One and Only" (track 3) as children paint.

- Write single words of the Text Truth on sticky notes.

GLUE PAPER STRIPS

Tools: Bible, construction paper, torn paper scraps in various colors, glue sticks, Activity Page

- Show children the picture on the Activity Page. Talk about Daniel's decision to continue praying even though the king said no one could pray to God.
- Remark that Daniel knew that the king would probably not like Daniel's decision. But Daniel knew he had to obey God rather than the king.
- Direct children to glue torn paper strips on the paper to create unique designs. As children work, thank God for keeping Daniel safe from the lions. Thank God for taking care of us.
- Say: "Daniel knew that God rescues and delivers people who obey Him."

ROLL & TELL

Tools: Bible; Story Pictures from Sessions 5, 6, 7; large ball

- Lay the three pictures on the floor, then ask several children to sit in a large circle with the pictures in the center.
- Say: "Let's roll the ball. When you receive the ball, choose a picture and tell us something you remember about that Bible story."
- Help children recall stories about Daniel and his friends.
- After everyone has a turn to tell what he remembers, say: "All of these stories are in the Bible in the book of Daniel."

BUILD A HOUSE FOR DANIEL

Tools: Bible, wooden and cardboard blocks, Daniel Story Figures (Pack Item 26), Preschool Family Card

- Invite preschoolers to build and play with blocks.
 Suggest that preschoolers build a Bible times house similar to the one shown in the picture on the Family Card.
- Move the Daniel story figure toward the block house and pretend to go upstairs. Summarize the Bible story, commenting that Daniel went to his house and prayed in the morning, in the middle of the day, and at nighttime.
- Use other story figures to help boys and girls tell what they remember from other stories about Daniel.

PLAY MUSICAL CHAIRS

Tools: Bible, chairs (1 per child), large sticky note, Music & Print Extras

- Use the sticky note to mark the book of Daniel in the Bible.
- Place chairs in a circle facing outward. Lay the Bible in a chair.
- Play music and tell children to walk slowly around the circle of chairs.
- Stop the music. Direct preschoolers to sit in the chairs. Tell the child who sits in the chair with the Bible to open it to the page with the sticky note.
- Say: "You found the book of Daniel. A verse in Daniel says that God is the living God. He rescues and delivers."

WALK ON A CARPET

Tools: Bible; Bible People Wheel (Pack Item 32); long piece of red carpet, narrow red cloth, or large red bath towel; plain toy crown

- Lay the cloth or rug on the floor in an open space. Put the Bible People Wheel and Bible near the cloth.
- When a child shows interest in the cloth, extend the crown to him.
- Say: "Kings and queens often wear crowns when they greet people at their palace or other places. Sometimes the kings and queens walk on special carpets or rugs."
- Invite the child to wear the crown and walk on the rug like a queen or king.
- Turn the Bible People Wheel to find a picture of Esther.

SHAKE & SAY

Tools: Bible; rainsticks, jingle bells, or maracas; sentence strip with Bible verse printed on it; tape

- Mark Joshua 1:9 in the Bible. Tape the sentence strip on a wall at children's eye level.
- Read the Bible verse from the sentence strip. Say: "Let's say the Bible verse together. Shake your instrument each time you say a word."
- Offer a couple of children an instrument. Help children say the Bible verse a few times.
- Remark: "Esther was in a strange place and learned new things. She was brave. We can be brave in strange places and remember that God is with us wherever we go."

MAKE A COLLAGE

Tools: Bible, small pieces of shiny or embroidered fabric, gold and silver ribbons, clear contact plastic, tray

- Put the collage materials on a tray. Tape the plastic to the wall with the sticky side out at children's eye level.
- Explain that kings and queens often wear clothes made of shiny and showy fabrics. Pick up a fabric piece or ribbon and use it to mark Esther 1 in the Bible.
- Ask children what they think Esther's clothes may have looked like when she became queen.
- Encourage children to create a collage using the art materials. As children work, tell more about Esther.

ARRANGE LETTER CUPS

Tools: Bible, large plastic cups, permanent marker, Bible Book Markers (Pack Item 23), Story Picture: A New Queen (Pack Item 8)

- On each cup, write one letter of Esther's name. Stack the cups in random order.
- Open the Bible to Esther 1 and lay the Esther Bible Book Marker on the page. Put the Story Picture nearby.
- Point to the Bible and tell a child that today we are learning about a woman named Esther. Her story is in the Bible.
- Direct the preschooler to say the letters of Esther's name. Then say: "Look at the letters on the cups. Can you put the letters in order to spell Esther's name?"
- When the child correctly sequences the cups, help him find Esther's name in the Bible.

CIRCLE TIME

GATHER

- Play music and tap rhythm sticks to signal children to gather for Circle Time.
- When children are in the circle, read the Book: *I Can Pray* (Pack Item 19).

REVIEW THE BIBLE STORY

- Say: "Today we've heard about a woman, a man, and people who prayed for three days. Help me remember the story."
- Ask children to tell you what they remember about Queen Esther.
- Ask: "Who helped Esther be brave?" (God)

- Ask teachers in the circle to assist preschoolers.
- Say: "The Bible has true stories about real people and places."

PRAY

 Thank God for helping people be brave. Ask God to help preschoolers turn to God when they are scared.

WRAP UP

 Form groups of two or three preschoolers and a teacher. Look at the Activity Page, review the Bible story, and say the Bible verse.

PRACTICE BIBLE SKILLS

- Distribute Bibles to the children and give each child a sticky note.
- Say: "Our Bible story was about Esther. A book in the Bible is called Esther. Let's find the book and mark it with the sticky note."



MOVE THROUGH AN OBSTACLE COURSE

Tools: Bible; various items to use in an obstacle course (plastic hoops, child-size chairs, plastic cones, low step stool, cardboard box, and so on); Activity Page

- Arrange an obstacle course for preschoolers to move through. Include obstacles that children can go under, move around, crawl through, and so on. Place the Bible at the end of the course.
- Show children the picture of Esther and recall that Esther faced a very challenging situation. But God helped Esther be brave.
- Invite children to move through the course. At the end, sit down to open the Bible to Psalm 27:1. Say:
 "A psalm begins with the words 'I will not be afraid. God will help me.' Do you think Esther trusted God to help her?"
- Ask preschoolers to tell about times when they have been challenged or afraid and needed God's help.

MAKE A STICKER PICTURE

Tools: Bible, Story Picture: Esther Helped Her People (Pack Item 9), paper, marker, colorful stickers or small office dot stickers, crayons

- Use large letters to write the statement *God will help* me on a piece of paper (one paper for each child).
- Invite children to use crayons and stickers to decorate their papers. Children may trace the letters of God's name.
- Encourage children's creativity. While preschoolers work, recall the Bible story about brave Esther. Say: "Esther prayed for three days. Then she went to see the king. God helped Esther know what to do." Show the Story Picture.

IDENTIFY OBJECTS IN A BAG

Tools: Bible; 4 square sticky notes; 4 objects such as a toy car, small Bible, plastic cup, wooden block; marker; tape; tote bag with string; Preschool Family Card; October Verse Markers (Pack Item 29)

- Write these words on the sticky notes (1 word per note): *God, Help, Brave, Pray.* Tape one note to each object, then drop all the objects in the bag.
- Mark Esther 3 with the Family Card and put today's Verse Marker at Psalm 27:1. Put the Bible next to the tote bag.
- When a child seems interested, invite him to guess
 what might be in the tote bag. Say: "Feel something
 in the bag and tell what it is." After the child guesses,
 tell him to remove the item. Read the word on the
 sticky note and relate it to today's Bible story, Text
 Truth, or Bible verse.
- After all the objects are removed, return them to the bag for another child to have a turn.

CLICK & SAY

Tools: Bible, pairs of rhythm sticks or wooden dowels

- Give preschoolers pairs of rhythm sticks. Ask preschoolers to click the rhythm of these words: *I will not be afraid. I will not be afraid. I will not be afraid. God will help me.*
- Repeat the chant. This time direct children to clap their hands to the rhythm.
- Open the Bible to Psalm 27:1. Remark that the words you chanted are from the Bible.

• Form three groups of children. Tell the first group to say "I live for Jesus," the second group to say "who loved me and gave Himself for me," and the third group to say "Galatians 2:20b."



PLAY WITH TOY VEHICLES

Tools: Bible, masking tape, toy cars and trucks, blocks, toy road signs (opt.)

- Create masking tape roadways on the floor. Add the road signs if you have some available.
- While children have fun driving vehicles, talk about places they travel. Remark that Paul traveled to many places to teach people about Jesus. Sometimes Paul wrote letters to church friends to remind them of what they should do for Jesus.
- Summarize Paul's letter to the Galatian church friends.
- Ask preschoolers how they came to church today.
 Thank God for families and friends who help children learn to do the things Jesus said to do.

PAINT WITH WATERCOLORS

Tools: Bible, November Verse Markers (Pack Item 30), paper, watercolor paints, cups of water, paintbrushes, marker, painting smock

- Mark the Bible verse with the marker and write today's Text Truth on several pieces of paper.
- Invite children to decorate the Text Truth papers. As preschoolers paint, recall that Paul wrote a letter to church friends in Galatia and told them they should do the things Jesus said to do.
- Say: "Paul loved the people, and he cared about them. Paul wanted the people to follow Jesus' example. Paul said, 'I live for Jesus, who loved me and gave Himself for me."
- Show children the verse in the Bible and help children say it a few times.

FIND BIBLE STORIES

Tools: CSB® Read to Me Bible, 4 colors of paper, scissors, tape, beanbag

- Cut a 3-inch strip from each sheet of paper, leaving a 9-inch square. Tape the squares together to make a gameboard. Use the cut-off strips to mark four illustrations of stories about Jesus in the Bible.
- Give a child the beanbag and tell her to toss it onto the gameboard. Tell her to open the Bible to the strip that is the same color.
- Look at the picture. Ask the preschooler what she knows about this story.
- After a few turns, mark other Bible story pictures about Jesus. Tell preschoolers they are learning about Jesus and the things He said to do.

TOSS RINGS ON BOTTLES

Tools: Bible, sturdy paper plates (1 per child), markers, stickers, plastic water bottles, scissors, Story Picture: People Learned Who to Obey (Pack Item 10)

- Cut the center out of the paper plates to create rings. Give children stickers and markers to decorate the rings. Write a child's name on his ring.
- Arrange the plastic bottles on the floor a foot apart.
- Direct children to form a line facing the bottles. Invite each child to toss his ring onto a bottle.
- While children toss rings, remark that their rings resemble the letter O. Say: "Paul told the people in the church to obey the things Jesus told them to do."

- Invite a preschooler to choose a puzzle to work. Remark that all of the puzzles help us think about Paul's letter to the church people.
- Summarize the Bible story and show preschoolers the place in the Bible where we find the letter to the Galatians.
- Say: "Paul reminded the church people to work for the good of everyone."

WALK THROUGH YOUR CHURCH

Tools: Bible, Preschool Family Card, paper, marker

- Take groups of 2-4 children on a quiet walk through the church building. Tell the children to look and listen for people reading the Bible, singing, praying, helping, or showing love.
- After the walk, ask children what they observed. Say: "The people you saw today at our church love Jesus. They want to learn more about Him and be more like Him."
- Show children the picture on the Family Card.
 Point to Paul and say: "Paul wanted people to know about Jesus, too. Paul taught the people to serve one another through love just as Jesus did when He lived on earth."
- Summarize the Bible story as you return to the classroom.

STACK & ARRANGE SHOEBOXES

Tools: Bible, 6 shoeboxes, index cards, marker, tape, wooden blocks, craft stick

- Put the craft stick in the Bible at Galatians 6:10 to mark the Bible verse.
- Write single words of the Bible verse on separate cards. Tape a card on each shoebox. Put the shoeboxes on the floor near the Bible.
- Invite children to build with blocks. Preschoolers may notice the shoeboxes with words. Explain that the words are from the Bible.
- Guide children to arrange the blocks in order to form the Bible verse. Show children the verse in the Bible, then help children repeat the verse.

CUT PLAY DOUGH

Tools: Bible; fresh play dough; cards with the letters P, G, J, S on them; craft sticks; Story Picture: Paul's Reminder to Serve Others (Pack Item 11)

- Give a child some dough and show him a stick for cutting.
- Point to a letter and remark that a word from the Bible begins with that letter. Suggest that the child use his stick to "write" the letter in his dough or cut out dough letters. Relate the letters to Paul, Galatians, Jesus, and serving.
- Show the preschooler the Story Picture and summarize the Bible story. Comment: "Paul reminded the Galatians to remember Jesus and serve one another as Jesus served people."



- Line up the buckets on the floor about a foot apart.
 When a child notices the buckets, ask him to name
 the letters. Say: "Those letters spell the word pray.
 James wrote about prayer. James said to pray for one
 another."
- Continue: "Prayer is our way of talking to God. We can talk to God anywhere, anytime. We can talk to God about anything."
- Direct the child to stand a few feet from the buckets and toss a beanbag into each one. Lead the child to say the letter written on the bucket.
- When all the beanbags are in the buckets, show the preschooler the picture on the Activity Page. Ask: "What are the people doing?" (praying together)
- Say: "We can pray with other people, too. And we can pray alone. God will hear us."


DESIGN A PRAYER REMINDER

Tools: Bible, paper, crayons or washable markers, colorful stickers, Preschool Family Card

- Cut sheets of paper in half lengthwise. Print the Bible verse and reference on each strip of paper.
- Give a child a paper to decorate. Read the words on the paper. Comment that the Bible tells people to pray and ask God to help them anytime.
- Mention times when people talk to God and things for which they ask His help.
- Show the child the picture on the Family Card.




