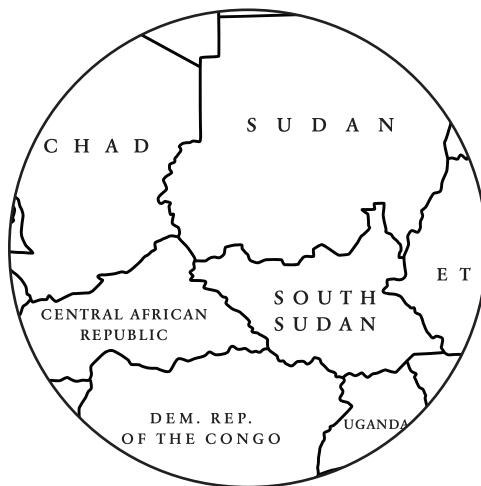


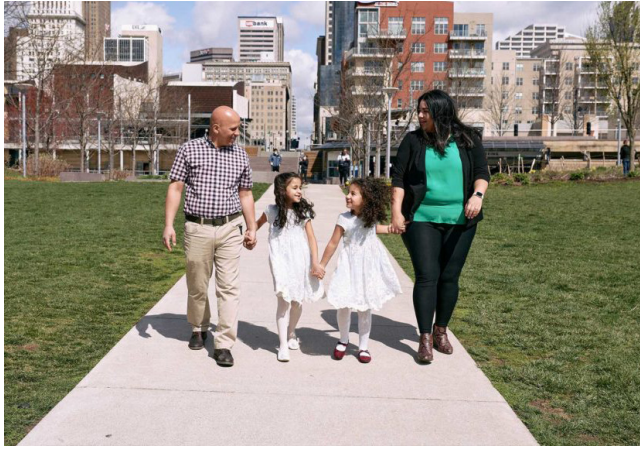

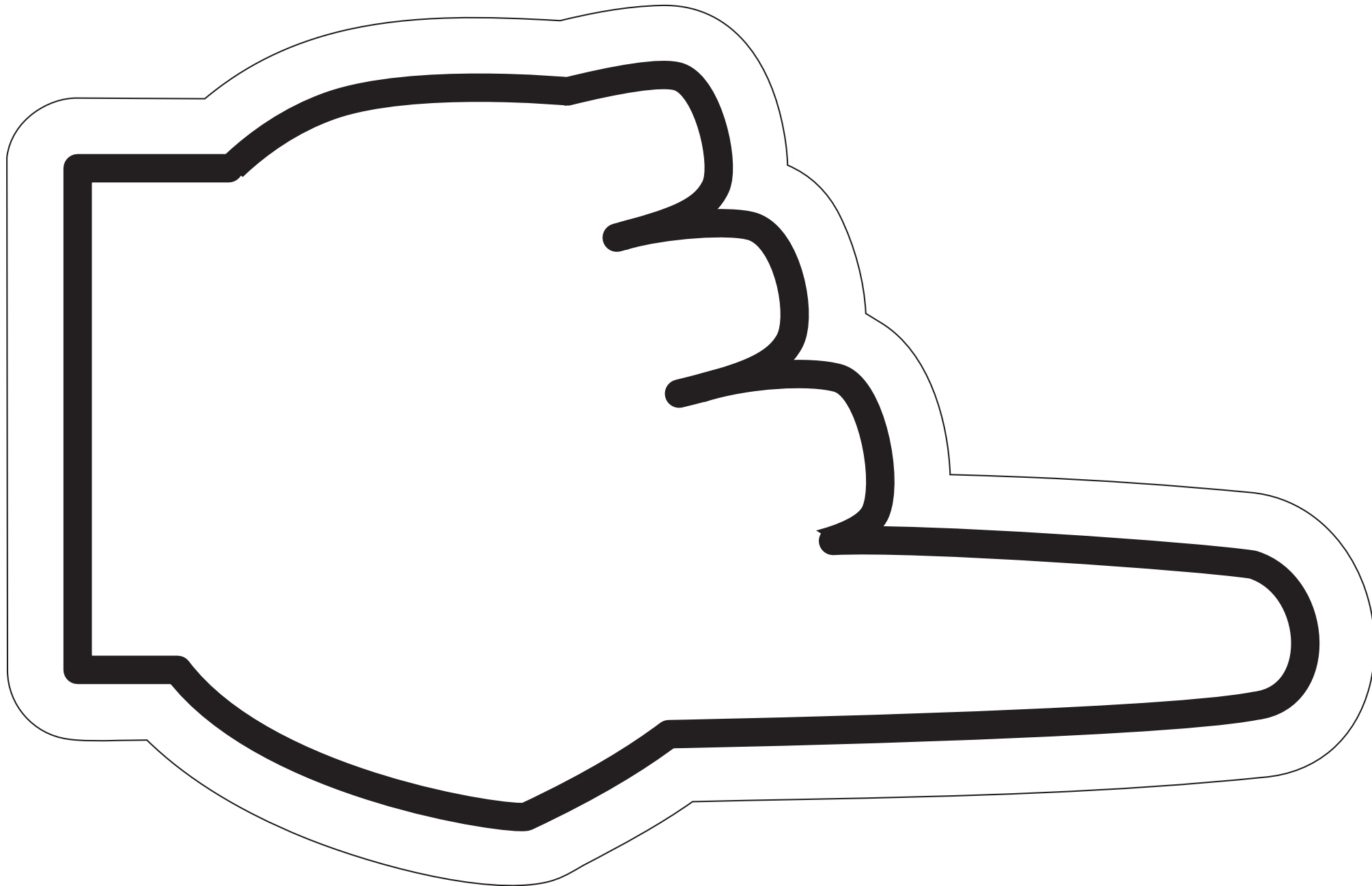

PROCEDURES

1. Distribute a plastic water bottle to each kid.
2. Lead kids to completely cover the plastic bottle with duct tape, smoothing out any kinks as they place the tape.
3. Provide the cardstock sheets of paper and encourage kids to cut out two triangular wing shapes, a tail, and a propeller that will have a circle in the middle to go around the bottle top and a triangular extension on each side of the circle. Also cut out some circles for windows.
4. Make a small fold on one end of each wing and the tail to tape the wings and tail neatly on the bottle.
5. Unscrew the bottle top and place the round center of the propeller over the opening of the bottle. Then place the top over the propeller.

7. Use markers to add designs to the wings and tail of the plane.
8. Assist kids to cut a slit in the top of the planes with the scissors (or a craft knife) to use their airplanes as a bank to save money for a missions offering.

INGREDIENTS AND UTENSILS

Bread knives

Sugar wafer cookies
Chocolate sandwich cookies
Vanilla sandwich cookies
Candy coating in pink, orange, and white
Red candy-coated candies
Multicolored sprinkles
Microwave
Napkins or paper plates
Scissors
Ziplock bags

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Use a bread knife to trim the ends of sugar wafer cookies into a pointed cone-shaped cookie. Use gentle pressure and a sawing-type motion to make the cuts.
2. Microwave the orange, pink, and white candy coatings in separate ziplock bags and cut the tips of the bags. Squeeze some of the orange melted candy onto the top of the sugar wafer cookies to attach the sandwich cookies to the tops of the sugar wafer "cones."
3. Place an amount of pink or white candy melt onto the tops of the sandwich cookies as the top layer of ice cream.
4. Add the sprinkles as desired on top of the candy melt on the sandwich cookies.
5. Use a small dot of the candy coating to secure a red candy-coated candy to the top of the sandwich cookie with candy coating as the "cherry on top."
6. Set aside on napkins or paper plates to allow candy coatings to harden.
7. Enjoy your "ice cream cone" cookie!

What Are the Drill Commands?



Attention

Stand straight, one foot not extended in front of the other, eyes focused on the caller until the command Start is given. Hold your Bible at your side (in either hand) with the Bible's spine down.

Present Bibles

This call is used only in the Book Calls and Key Passage Calls. Bring your Bible to waistline, parallel with the floor. Following the Present Bible command, the caller announces the call.

If you search with your right hand, hold the Bible in your left hand with Genesis down and with the right hand resting flat on the back of the Bible and no fingers extending over the edges.

If you search with your left hand, hold the Bible in your right hand, Genesis up, with the left hand resting flat on the front of your Bible and no fingers extending over the edges.



Start

This command is the signal for you to step forward or begin searching in your Bibles. For the Book Call and Key Passage Call, begin searching in the Bible when the command is given. It is a mistake to begin before this command is given. In the Book Call, the index finger must be placed upon any part of that book.

In the Key Passage Call, find any part of the reference, place your index finger on any portion, and step forward.

For the Quotation or Completion Calls, step forward when you can say the verse.

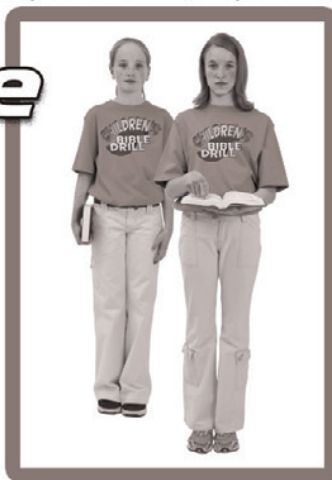
Time

The timekeeper calls out Time at the end of 10 seconds. No one may step forward after this command, and all children should stop searching in their Bibles.

The caller calls on one child by number who will give a response.

The other children will remain quiet while the one called on responds.

If the child called on does not give the right response, the caller calls on another child.



Attention

Close the Bible, return it to its original position, and take one step back.
