THE GOSPEL GOD'S PLAN FOR ME

The word *gospel* means "good news."

It is the message about Christ, the kingdom of God, and salvation.

The Bible tells us God created everything, including you and me, and He is in charge of everything. Invite a volunteer to recite Genesis 1:1 from memory or read it from his Bible. Read Revelation 4:11 and Colossians 1:16-17.

(Romans 3:23). The Bible calls this sin. Because God is holy, God cannot be around sin. Sin separates us from God and deserves God's punishment of death (Romans 6:23).

GOD PROVIDED. Read John 3:16 aloud. God sent His Son, Jesus, the perfect solution to our sin problem, to rescue us from the punishment we deserve. It's something we, as sinners, could never earn on our own. Jesus alone saves us. Read Ephesians 2:8-9.

JESUS GIVES. Jesus lived a perfect life, died on the cross for our sins, and rose again. Because Jesus gave up His life for us, we can be welcomed into God's family for eternity. This is the best gift ever! Read Romans 5:8; 2 Corinthians 5:21; or 1 Peter 3:18.

We can respond to Jesus. "The ABCs of Becoming a Christian" is a simple tool that helps us remember how to respond when prompted by the Holy Spirit to the gift Jesus offers.

ADMIT

Admit to God that you are a sinner. The first people God created chose to sin and disobey God. Ever since then, all people have chosen to sin and disobey (Romans 3:23). Tell God you messed up and you are sorry for doing your own thing and turning away from Him through your thoughts, words, and actions. Repent, turn away from your sin. (Acts 3:19; 1 John 1:9) Repent doesn't just mean turning from doing bad things to doing good things. It means turning from sin and even from your own good works and turning to Jesus, trusting only in Him to save you.

BELIEVE

Believe that Jesus is
God's Son and receive God's
gift of forgiveness from sin.
You must believe that only
Jesus can save you and you
cannot save yourself from
your sin problem—not even
by praying to God, going to
church, or reading your Bible.
Your faith or your trust is only
in Jesus and what He did for
you through His life, death,
and resurrection.
[Acts 16:31; Acts 4:12;
John 14:6; Ephesians 2:8-9]

CONFESS

Confess your faith in Jesus
Christ as Savior and Lord. Tell
God and tell others what you
believe. If Jesus is your Savior,
you are trusting only in Him to
save you. Jesus is also Lord,
which means He is in charge
and calling the shots in your
life. You can start following Him
and doing what He says in the
Bible. You are born again into
a new life and look forward to
being with God forever.
[Romans 10:9-10,13]

When he heard this, Jesus said, This sickness will not end in death. No, it is for God's glory so that God's Son may be glorified through it. (John 11:4, NIV)

Love consists in this: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. (1 John 4:10, CSB)

In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins. (1 John 4:10, ESV)


- Print a copy of both template pages for each kid. The first page is the outer cup design and handle. The second page provides the template for the inner cup with space to write prayer requests.
- Lead kids to use colored pencils to decorate the outer cup design. After kids have completed decorating their cups, assist kids as needed to cut out the cup template and handle. Tell kids to use the markers to write something they want to pray for this week related to the mission work in Seattle in each of the six sections of the inside cup template. Then guide kids to cut out the inner cup template.
- Distribute the cups and lead kids to use glue sticks to attach each template to the outside of a cup. Demonstrate how to attach the coffee cup handles to the outer cup by folding over each tab at the end of the "c" shape and gluing the tabs to the side of the cup. Use the craft knife to begin cutting the square to open the "window" to reveal the text on the inner cup. (Kids may be able to use scissors to cut out the entire square once the initial cuts with craft knife are made.) Show kids how to place the inner cup with their prayer needs inside the outer cup. Tell kids that they can spin the inner cup each day to reveal a new item to pray for.

Lazarus walked out of the tomb, alive and wrapped in linen.


