THE GOSPEL GOD'S PLAN FOR ME

The word *gospel* means "good news."

It is the message about Christ, the kingdom of God, and salvation.

GOD RULES. The Bible tells us God created everything, including you and me, and He is in charge of everything. Invite a volunteer to recite Genesis 1:1 from memory or read it from his Bible. Read Revelation 4:11 and Colossians 1:16-17.

(Romans 3:23). The Bible calls this sin. Because God is holy, God cannot be around sin. Sin separates us from God and deserves God's punishment of death (Romans 6:23).

GOD PROVIDED. Read John 3:16 aloud. God sent His Son, Jesus, the perfect solution to our sin problem, to rescue us from the punishment we deserve. It's something we, as sinners, could never earn on our own. Jesus alone saves us. Read Ephesians 2:8-9.

JESUS GIVES. Jesus lived a perfect life, died on the cross for our sins, and rose again. Because Jesus gave up His life for us, we can be welcomed into God's family for eternity. This is the best gift ever! Read Romans 5:8; 2 Corinthians 5:21; or 1 Peter 3:18.

Christian" is a simple tool that helps us remember how to respond when prompted by the Holy Spirit to the gift Jesus offers.

ADMIT

Admit to God that you are a sinner. The first people God created chose to sin and disobey God. Ever since then, all people have chosen to sin and disobey (Romans 3:23). Tell God you messed up and you are sorry for doing your own thing and turning away from Him through your thoughts, words, and actions. Repent, turn away from your sin. (Acts 3:19; 1 John 1:9) Repent doesn't just mean turning from doing bad things to doing good things. It means turning from sin and even from your own good works and turning to Jesus, trusting only in Him to save you.

BELIEVE

Believe that Jesus is
God's Son and receive God's
gift of forgiveness from sin.
You must believe that only
Jesus can save you and you
cannot save yourself from
your sin problem—not even
by praying to God, going to
church, or reading your Bible.
Your faith or your trust is only
in Jesus and what He did for
you through His life, death,
and resurrection.
(Acts 16:31; Acts 4:12;
John 14:6; Ephesians 2:8-9)

CONFESS

Confess your faith in Jesus
Christ as Savior and Lord. Tell
God and tell others what you
believe. If Jesus is your Savior,
you are trusting only in Him to
save you. Jesus is also Lord,
which means He is in charge and
calling the shots in your life.
You can start following Him and
doing what He says in the Bible.
You are born again into a new
life and look forward to being
with God forever.
(Romans 10:9-10,13)


Supplies Needed:

White cardstock paper (2 sheets per kid)
Notebook paper (3-4 sheets per kid)
Black markers
Pencils
Kid safety scissors
Glue
Stapler
Something with a circular base to trace around



Procedures:

- 1. Distribute two pieces of cardstock paper, three to four sheets of notebook paper, and pencils to each kid.
- 2. Trace a circle on each cardstock sheet, leaving room to draw and cut ears from one part of the sheets. Draw half circles to glue to the heads as ears. Cut the two head circles and four ear half-circles out. Glue the ears to the backs of the circles.
- 3. Trace circles on the lined notebook paper, making three to four circles per page. Cut out all of the circles.
- 4. On one of the panda head circles, use black markers to draw two slanted ovals for the panda's eyes, then inside each of the ovals, draw a smaller circle. Color in the large ovals around the circle and then draw a small black dot in the circle to complete the eyes.
- 5. Make a smaller black circle below the eyes for the nose, and draw what looks like a capital J from the center of the nose, and add a hook to the right as well at the bottom of the J to form the mouth.
- 6. Color the ears black on both sides of the panda's head. Stack all notebook paper circles on top of the the panda's head back and place the panda's face on the top. Be sure all the circles are lined up and attach the notebook together with a staple to the left of the pages to create a panda notebook.


