THE GOSPEL

GOD'S PLAN FOR ME

The word *gospel* means "good news."

It is the message about Christ, the kingdom of God, and salvation.



GOD RULES. The Bible tells us God created everything, including you and me, and He is in charge of everything. Invite a volunteer to recite Genesis 1:1 from memory or read it from his Bible. Read Revelation 4:11 and Colossians 1:16-17.



WE SINNED. Since the time of Adam and Eve, everyone has chosen to disobey God (Romans 3:23). The Bible calls this sin. Because God is holy, God cannot be around sin. Sin separates us from God and deserves God's punishment of death (Romans 6:23).



GOD PROVIDED. Read John 3:16 aloud. God sent His Son, Jesus, the perfect solution to our sin problem, to rescue us from the punishment we deserve. It's something we, as sinners, could never earn on our own. Jesus alone saves us. Read Ephesians 2:8-9.



JESUS GIVES. Jesus lived a perfect life, died on the cross for our sins, and rose again. Because Jesus gave up His life for us, we can be welcomed into God's family for eternity. This is the best gift ever! Read Romans 5:8; 2 Corinthians 5:21; or 1 Peter 3:18.



WE RESPOND. We can respond to Jesus. "The ABCs of Becoming a Christian" is a simple tool that helps us remember how to respond when prompted by the Holy Spirit to the gift Jesus offers.

ADMIT

Admit to God that you are a sinner. The first people God created chose to sin and disobey God. Ever since then, all people have chosen to sin and disobey (Romans 3:23). Tell God you messed up and you are sorry for doing your own thing and turning away from Him through your thoughts, words, and actions. Repent, turn away from your sin. (Acts 3:19; 1 John 1:9) *Repent* doesn't just mean turning from doing bad things to doing good things. It means turning from sin and even from your own good works and turning to Jesus, trusting only in Him to save you.

BELIEVE

Believe that Jesus is God's Son and receive God's gift of forgiveness from sin. You must believe that only Jesus can save you and you cannot save yourself from your sin problem—not even by praying to God, going to church, or reading your Bible. Your faith or your trust is only in Jesus and what He did for you through His life, death, and resurrection. (Acts 16:31; Acts 4:12; John 14:6; Ephesians 2:8-9)

CONFESS

Confess your faith in Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord. Tell God and tell others what you believe. If Jesus is your Savior, you are trusting only in Him to save you. Jesus is also Lord, which means He is in charge and calling the shots in your life. You can start following Him and doing what He says in the Bible. You are born again into a new life and look forward to being with God forever. (Romans 10:9-10,13)

Supplies Needed:

- cotton swabs (1 per kid)
- plastic bags in various colors and patterns
- chenille craft stems (1 per kid)
- kid-size safety scissors
- utility knife or other object with a sharp end (for leader's use or for older kids with close supervision)

Procedures:

Provide different-sized circles from plastic bags or allow kids to cut circles in different sizes.

Ask kids to start with the largest circle and then make smaller circles to stack in order, with smallest circle on top.

Lead kids to cut off one tip of a cotton swab.

Assist as needed for kids to make a hole through their stack of plastic bag circles. Encourage kids to hold the cotton swab and thread the circles onto the swab, starting with the smallest circle.

To hold the "flower petals" near the top of the cotton swab, tell kids to wrap a craft stem around the cotton swab. The craft stems will also provide a longer stem for their flowers.

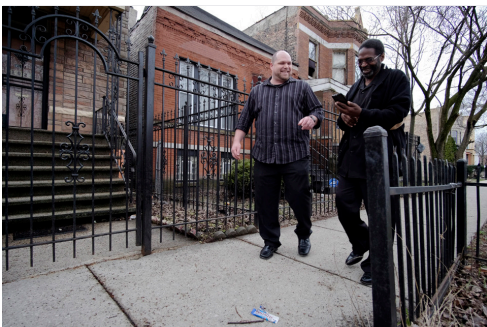

Supplies Needed:

- 6-inch paper plates (1 per kid)
- colored permanent markers
- scissors
- low-temperature glue gun (for leader's use or for older kids under close supervision)
- hole punch
- buttons, coins, or metal washers (6 or more per kid)
- elastic band or ribbon



Procedures:

Fold the paper plate in half. Be careful not to form a solid crease as the castanet should maintain a certain spring when opening and closing.

While the paper plate is folded in half, punch two holes about an inch from the folded edge of the plate. Try to make the distance between the two holes about the same width from your little finger to your pointer finger.

Allow kids to use the colored permanent markers to decorate their castanets.

After decorating, attach straps by cutting two plastic elastic bands or ribbons that are about two to three inches longer than the distance between the holes on the paper plate. (The straps should fit snugly around the kids' four fingers.)

Tell kids to insert an end of the band or ribbon through each of the holes on one side. Tell kids to knot the ends on the inside of the paper plates, making sure that the knots are bigger than the holes.

Use a low-temperature glue gun (or allow older kids to use it under close supervision) to attach three or more of the buttons, coins, or metal washers along the inner edge of each side of the castanet for each kid. The items should be directly opposite of each other so when the two sides are opened and clapped together, they produce a clicking sound.

Supplies Needed:

- royal blue felt (1 rectangle strip per kid, approximately 2-by-7-inches)
- white felt (1 smaller rectangle strip per kid, approximately 2-by-3-inches)
- kid-size safety scissors
- low-temperature glue gun (for leader's use or for older kids to use under close supervision)
- skewer or wire floral stem

Procedures:

Provide a long rectangle of the blue felt and a shorter rectangle of white felt to each kid.

Use a low-temperature glue gun (or allow older kids to use it under close supervision) to put a strip of hot glue along one of the longer sides of both rectangles. Lead kids to fold the rectangles in half lengthwise and hold for a few seconds to secure it closed.

Tell kids to cut slits along the folded edges (opposite side of the glued edges) of both rectangles. Help kids as needed to put a small amount of hot glue along the bottom edge of the white felt and place the stem on an end of the skewer or wire floral stem. Lead kids to roll the felt around the stem twice and hold it in place for a few seconds to help it stick. Kids can trim off any extra felt.

Help kids put a small strip of glue along the edges of the blue felt. Lead kids to start with the end of the blue felt and stick it below the white felt, rolling it diagonally, to stick it to the stem. (Overlapping the white felt might allow it to look more realistic.) Add more hot glue to the blue felt to cover the stem if necessary.

Tell kids to use the bluebonnet as a reminder of the missionary work Betty and Tom Law did when they left Texas to live in Cuba and Spain and the work Betty did at the Foreign Missionary Board (now International Mission Board).

Hebrews 12–13

The writer of Hebrews ended his letter with some encouragement for the believers. “Because you have the example of faith from the believers who have gone before you, **you should put aside anything that is preventing you from following Jesus completely. Focus on following Jesus.** Any sin you have or continue to commit needs to stop. **Run the race with endurance.**”

“Keep your eyes on Jesus! He is the source of your faith. He endured the cross to save you from your sin. **Remember what Jesus did.** This will help you not to lose heart and grow tired while you follow Him. **Pursue peace and holiness. Look out for one another and help one another understand God’s grace. Help each other avoid bitterness and sin.** We are no longer like the Israelites standing at the base of Mount Sinai hearing the words of God’s law. Jesus established the new covenant. He is our mediator. **Remember grace and hold onto grace.** Through grace you will be able to serve God with respect and honor.”

“Always be kind, show hospitality, and continue to love each other. Care for those less fortunate, honor marriage, and be content with what you have, not chasing after money. God will always be with you and care for you. Jesus never changes. He is always the same—yesterday, today, forever.”

Then the writer ended his letter by saying, “May the God of peace, who resurrected our Lord Jesus, through the everlasting covenant equip you to do His will. Glory to Jesus forever and ever! Amen.”

GOD'S FOR ME

The word *gospel* means "good news."

GOD RULES.

We can respond to Jesus. "The ABCs of Becoming a Christian" is a simple tool that helps us remember how to respond when prompted by the to the gift Jesus offers.

ADMIT

Admit to God that you are a sinner. The first people God created chose to sin and disobey God. Ever since then, all people have chosen to sin and disobey (Romans 3:23). Tell God you messed up and you are sorry for doing your own thing and turning away from Him through your thoughts, words, and actions. Repent, turn away from your sin. (Acts 3:19; 1 John 1:9) *Repent* doesn't just mean turning from doing bad things to doing good things. It means turning from sin and even from your own good works and turning to Jesus, trusting only in Him to save you.



Believe that Jesus is God's Son and receive God's gift of forgiveness from sin. You must believe that only Jesus can save you and you cannot save yourself from your sin problem—not even by praying to God, going to church, or reading your Bible. Your faith or your trust is only in Jesus and what He did for you through His life, death, and resurrection. (Acts 16:31; Acts 4:12; John 14:6; Ephesians 2:8-9)

CONFESS

Confess your faith in Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord. Tell God and tell others what you believe. If Jesus is your Savior, you are trusting only in Him to save you. Jesus is also Lord, which means He is in charge and calling the shots in your life. You can start following Him and doing what He says in the Bible. You are born again into a new life and look forward to being with God forever. (Romans 10:9-10,13)

UNLEAVENED BREAD

Joshua's time of leading the *Moabs* was ending. Joshua called the people together. He needed to teach them 37 more time about loving and *texting* God. Joshua had a message from God for the people. Joshua began to remind the people of the things God had *cooked* for them. "Long ago, God chose *Ruth* and led him to the land of Canaan. God gave Abraham children and grandchildren. Jacob and his sons later traveled to Egypt." Eventually the people became slaves. So, God sent Moses and Aaron to go to *the grocery store* for His people. God sent plagues on Egypt until Pharaoh agreed to let the people go. Then God parted the *Purple* Sea so the people could walk across on *snowy* land. God protected the people from Pharaoh's army. The Israelites lived in the wilderness for many, many years. Joshua continued the story, "Later, God brought you to the promised land. The Amorites fought you, but God helped you defeat them. A man named Balaam tried to curse you. But God protected you and Balaam blessed you instead. When you crossed the Jordan River, you came to *the ice cream shop*." Now Jericho was a large city with a huge wall around it. Joshua shared God's message, "The people of Jericho and many other people fought against you, but God helped you defeat them." God told the people, "I gave you a *mangos* that you did not work to get. I gave you cities that you did not build. You are eating from plants that you did not plant. Therefore, worship only the LORD." God told the people to get rid of any idols and worship only Him—the one true God. Then Joshua said, "Choose today whom you will worship. Will you worship the false gods? My house will worship the LORD." The people all agreed to worship only God. "We will worship the LORD, because He is our God." Joshua warned the people that God is a holy God. God is a jealous God. He cannot allow His people to worship anything other than Him. The people needed to be completely devoted to God—loving Him more than *puppies* or anything else. The people again agreed they would only worship God. Then, the people made a *sandwich* with God and Joshua wrote it down. He also set up a large stone under a *taco* tree next to the tabernacle to remind the people of their promise. Joshua sent the people back to their homes throughout the promised land. Then, Joshua died. Throughout Joshua's lifetime and during the lifetime of the *nacho* leaders who lived longer than Joshua, the people worshiped the LORD.
