THE GOSPEL

GOD'S PLAN FOR ME

The word *gospel* means "good news."

It is the message about Christ, the kingdom of God, and salvation.



GOD RULES. The Bible tells us God created everything, including you and me, and He is in charge of everything. Invite a volunteer to recite Genesis 1:1 from memory or read it from his Bible. Read Revelation 4:11 and Colossians 1:16-17.



WE SINNED. Since the time of Adam and Eve, everyone has chosen to disobey God (Romans 3:23). The Bible calls this sin. Because God is holy, God cannot be around sin. Sin separates us from God and deserves God's punishment of death (Romans 6:23).



GOD PROVIDED. Read John 3:16 aloud. God sent His Son, Jesus, the perfect solution to our sin problem, to rescue us from the punishment we deserve. It's something we, as sinners, could never earn on our own. Jesus alone saves us. Read Ephesians 2:8-9.



JESUS GIVES. Jesus lived a perfect life, died on the cross for our sins, and rose again. Because Jesus gave up His life for us, we can be welcomed into God's family for eternity. This is the best gift ever! Read Romans 5:8; 2 Corinthians 5:21; or 1 Peter 3:18.



WE RESPOND. We can respond to Jesus. "The ABCs of Becoming a Christian" is a simple tool that helps us remember how to respond when prompted by the Holy Spirit to the gift Jesus offers.

ADMIT

Admit to God that you are a sinner. The first people God created chose to sin and disobey God. Ever since then, all people have chosen to sin and disobey (Romans 3:23). Tell God you messed up and you are sorry for doing your own thing and turning away from Him through your thoughts, words, and actions. Repent, turn away from your sin. (Acts 3:19; 1 John 1:9) *Repent* doesn't just mean turning from doing bad things to doing good things. It means turning from sin and even from your own good works and turning to Jesus, trusting only in Him to save you.

BELIEVE

Believe that Jesus is God's Son and receive God's gift of forgiveness from sin. You must believe that only Jesus can save you and you cannot save yourself from your sin problem—not even by praying to God, going to church, or reading your Bible. Your faith or your trust is only in Jesus and what He did for you through His life, death, and resurrection. (Acts 16:31; Acts 4:12; John 14:6; Ephesians 2:8-9)

CONFESS

Confess your faith in Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord. Tell God and tell others what you believe. If Jesus is your Savior, you are trusting only in Him to save you. Jesus is also Lord, which means He is in charge and calling the shots in your life. You can start following Him and doing what He says in the Bible. You are born again into a new life and look forward to being with God forever. (Romans 10:9-10,13)

Session 1

Jesus Began His Ministry

Mark 1:9-38

When it was time for Jesus to begin teaching and preaching, He found John. Jesus asked John to baptize Him. Then Jesus went to the wilderness for 40 days.

After these things took place, Jesus went to Galilee to begin telling people the good news that God sent Jesus to help people. As Jesus walked by the sea, Jesus saw two brothers, Simon and Andrew. They were fishermen. Jesus stopped and talked to the fishermen. Jesus said, "Come with Me."

The brothers dropped their nets and followed Jesus.

Jesus and the brothers walked to a town. Two more brothers—James and John—decided to follow Jesus, too, and be His helpers.

Jesus and the brothers went to the synagogue (church). Jesus began to teach. The people at the synagogue were amazed at Jesus' teaching.

Jesus made a sick woman well. The people in the town were again amazed that Jesus did this, so they brought their sick friends and family members to Jesus.

People began to look for Jesus. Jesus' helpers said, "Everyone's looking for You."

So, Jesus kept on going to towns to teach about God and help people. Jesus cared about the people and loved them. Everywhere He went, Jesus served the people.

Session 2
The Four Friends
Mark 2:1-12

One day Jesus was teaching at a house in Capernaum. People filled the house, and many people stood outside. The people were there to hear Jesus teach and see Him help sick people.

Four men had a friend who could not walk. The men had heard about Jesus and knew He could help.

The friends decided to take their friend to Jesus. They picked up the corners of the mat on which their friend lay. The men carried their friend on his mat all the way to the house where Jesus was teaching.

But too many people were in the way. The people would not move so the men could go inside the house to see Jesus.

What now? The men saw steps leading up to the rooftop of the house. Up, up, up the steps the men walked. Then the men dug a hole in the roof. They carefully lowered their friend to the floor in front of Jesus.

Jesus saw the man and said, "You are forgiven." Then Jesus said, "Get up. Take your mat and go."

The man got up. He took a few steps. He could walk! "God is wonderful," the man said. He picked up his mat and walked out of the house.

Everyone was amazed at what had happened. The people praised God. "We have never seen anything like this!" they said.

Session 3
The Parable of the Sower
Mark 4:1-20

Day after day people followed Jesus around the countryside. The people saw Jesus do many wonderful things and they heard Jesus teach about God and His laws. The people were amazed.

Some people believed everything Jesus told them, but others wondered about the things Jesus said. Some people did not understand or know about the things Jesus taught.

One day Jesus left a house and went to the seashore. Jesus got into a boat and sat down while the people stood on the shore.

Jesus taught the people by using stories (the Bible calls them parables) about farmers planting seed, people burying treasures, workers in the field, lost sheep, a kind man, and many other things.

Jesus' disciples asked Jesus, "Why do You use parables to teach people?"

Jesus explained that not everyone knew all the things God had planned for Jesus. Jesus reminded His disciples that they knew about these things. Jesus said, "I use parables because other people do not listen or understand."

Jesus told His disciples that it was good they could see Jesus and hear Him teach and understand. Jesus wanted all people to listen to His parables and understand.

Session 4
Jesus Calmed a Storm
Mark 4:35-41

Jesus was teaching people beside the lake. A lot of people gathered around, so Jesus got into a boat. He asked His disciples to take the boat out on the lake.

When it began to get dark, Jesus said, "Let's go to the other side of the lake." So, Jesus and His disciples went farther out on the lake. Other boats went with them across the lake.

While Jesus and His disciples were on the lake, a big storm came up. The wind began to blow hard. The waves were big and crashed into the boat.

Jesus was asleep in the back of the boat. His disciples woke Him up. The men were afraid of the storm. "Save us! We are going to die!"

Jesus said to His disciples, "Why are you so afraid? Don't you know that I will take care of you?"

Jesus stood up and told the wind and the waves to be quiet and to be still. The wind stopped, and the waves calmed down.

The disciples were amazed. "Who is this man?" they wondered. Even the wind and the water obeyed Jesus!

Session 5

Jesus Healed a Woman and a Girl

Mark 5:21-43

Jesus was by the sea when many people gathered around Him.

Jairus was in the crowd. Jairus was a church leader in the town. He ran to Jesus and said, "Jesus, Jesus. My little girl is very, very sick. Please come to my house and make her well."

Jesus began walking to Jairus' house. A crowd of people followed Jesus. Everyone wanted to see what Jesus would do.

A sick woman was also in the crowd. She had been sick a long time and nothing had helped.

The woman knew Jesus healed sick people. The woman walked near Jesus and touched His robe. She said, "If I can just touch Jesus' robe, I will be well." And that is what happened.

Jesus felt the woman touch Him, and He told the woman, "You are well because you believed I could heal you."

At that time, people from Jairus' house ran up to Jesus. "It's too late! Jairus' daughter died.

The Teacher (Jesus) doesn't need to go to Jairus' house."

But Jesus said, "Don't be afraid. Only believe."

Jesus walked on to Jairus' house with three disciples. Jesus went inside the house to the girl's room. Jesus held the girl's hand and spoke to her. "Little girl, get up."

Immediately the little girl got up and began to walk. Jesus had made her well!

Session 6
Jesus Fed 5,000
Mark 6:30-44

Jesus and His disciples looked for a quiet place to rest. But crowds of people heard that Jesus was nearby, and the people followed Jesus. The people wanted to see Jesus and hear more of His teaching.

Jesus loved the people. All day Jesus talked to the people and made sick people well. At nighttime, everyone was tired and hungry. Jesus' disciples said, "It is late, Jesus. Send the people away so they can buy food for themselves."

But Jesus said, "You give them something to eat."

The disciples wondered how they could do this. They searched the crowd and could find only five loaves of bread and two fish. That would not be enough food for all the people! Jesus told the disciples to bring the bread and fish to Him. Then Jesus told the people to sit down on the grass.

Jesus thanked God for the food. Then He broke the bread into pieces for the disciples to serve to the people. Everyone had plenty of bread and fish to eat!

Then Jesus told the disciples to gather the food that was left over. The men picked up 12 baskets of food.

Jesus loved the people and cared about them.

Session 7
Peter's Confession
Mark 8:27-33

Jesus and His disciples traveled to many places and taught people. The men watched Jesus feed people and make sick people well. The disciples heard Jesus tell stories to help people understand what they should do. The disciples saw Jesus do miracles, things no one else could do.

One day Jesus asked His disciples a question. "Who do the people say that I am?"

This was an interesting question. The disciples knew Jesus was special and that God had sent Him. So they answered that some people said Jesus was a prophet or messenger like John or Elijah.

"But I am asking you, My friends," Jesus said. "Who do you say that I am?"

Peter was first to answer. "You are the Messiah, the Son of God!"

Jesus was pleased with Peter's answer. Jesus knew Peter only knew this was true because God had helped Peter know it.

Session 8

Jesus and the Children

Mark 9:33-37; 10:13-16

Everywhere Jesus went, people followed Him. The people listened to Jesus teach about God. Once when Jesus was in a house in Capernaum, Jesus talked about who would be with Him in heaven. Jesus' disciples had been arguing about this. Jesus then reached out to a child near Him and He held the child. Jesus said that whoever welcomes little children also welcomes Jesus. Jesus meant that God wants us to love and obey Him just as children love and obey parents.

Later, some families took their children to see Jesus. The mothers and daddies wanted Jesus to touch their children and pray for them.

Jesus' disciples saw the mothers and daddies trying to get close to Jesus. The disciples said, "Don't bother Jesus. He is busy. He does not have time for these children."

The children and families must have been sad when they heard these words.

Jesus heard what the disciples said to the families. He was sorry to hear what the men said. Jesus turned to the grown-ups and children and said: "Let the children come to Me. Do not send them away. Everyone should love God like these children love God."

Then Jesus touched the children and put His arms around them. Jesus told the children God loved them very much.

Session 9
The Rich Young Ruler
Mark 10:17-27

One day after Jesus had been teaching people, a man came up to Him. The man asked Jesus a question. The man wanted to know what good things he had to do to get to live with God forever.

Jesus asked the man why he asked this question. Then Jesus said, "Only one person is good, and He is God. You must obey God's commandments."

"Which ones?" the man asked Jesus.

Jesus told the man he should be truthful, obey his parents, and love others. Jesus reminded the man of God's other commandments.

The man said, "But I have obeyed all these commandments since I was a child."

Jesus looked with love at the man and said, "Go sell everything you have. Give everything to poor people. Then follow Me."

When the man heard this answer, he felt sad. He had lots of money and owned many things.

He was rich. He did not want to give up all his things. They were very important to him.

Jesus told His disciples that it is hard for people to forget about the things they own and give them away, even if it is what they need to do to be with God.

The disciples were surprised about the things Jesus said. But Jesus reminded them that loving Him and following Him are the most important things to do.

Session 10
The Red Sea
Exodus 13:17–14:31

The Israelites had lived in the land of Egypt a long time and been Pharaoh's slaves. But one day, Moses told the people it was time to leave Egypt.

Moses told the people God would go ahead of the people and show them which direction to travel. In the daytime, the people would see a pillar of cloud in front of them. At night, the people would see a pillar of fire. The cloud and the fire would always be in front of the people to guide them.

God told Moses and the Israelites to travel toward the sea. On the way, the people camped at the edge of the wilderness. God then told the people to go a different way to confuse the Egyptians.

Pharaoh decided he did not want the Israelites to leave and stop being his slaves. Pharaoh sent his soldiers to find the people and bring them back to Egypt. Pharaoh's soldiers discovered the Israelites camping by the sea.

When the Israelites saw Pharaoh's army coming after them, the people were terrified! They went to Moses and cried out to God to help them.

Moses told the people to stand strong and not be afraid. God would fight for them and rescue them from Pharaoh's army.

And that is what God did! God pushed back the water in the sea so the Israelites could walk to the other side on dry ground. When everyone was safely across, God caused the waters to flow back into the sea. Pharaoh's army drowned in the water, and God's people were safe.

God had rescued the people! The Israelites saw God's great power and believed in Him.

Session 11:
God Provided Manna and Quail
Exodus 16:1-36

God's people, the Israelites, were cranky! They had been traveling toward the land of Canaan and were now in the wilderness. The people were hot, thirsty, and hungry. They told Moses that things had been better for them when they were Pharaoh's slaves. At least they had plenty of food to eat and places to sleep.

God heard the people complaining. God told Moses: "I am going to send bread to the people. Every morning, the people should go out and gather enough bread for that day. No more and no less. It is a test to see if the people will obey Me."

Moses explained God's plan to the people. Moses said: "God told me that you will have meat to eat every night and bread every morning. You will know that God is good and provides for you."

The Israelites followed God's instructions. Six days of the week, the people gathered bread. On the sixth day, they gathered twice as much so they would have bread on the day of rest.

The people also baked and cooked what they needed for the day of rest.

The bread God sent to the people was called manna. It tasted like wafers made with honey. The bread was so special that Moses told his brother Aaron, the priest, to put manna in a jar and save it to remind God's people of how God took care of their needs.

Session 12

Offerings for the Tabernacle

Exodus 25:1-9; 31:1-11; 35:4-29

God wanted the Israelites to build a special place for God, a tabernacle. God's presence would be in the tabernacle when the people came to worship Him.

Many people and lots of materials would be needed to build the tabernacle. God said to Moses: "Tell the people to take an offering for Me. Everyone who is willing should give beautiful metals and fabrics. The people can give animal skins and wood and oil. Tell the people to give sparkling stones and gems. All the gifts will be used to build a beautiful sanctuary for Me."

Moses met with the men who would do the work. The men had been chosen because of their skills and wisdom and willingness to work. When it was time to begin building the tabernacle, Moses gave the people's offerings to the workers.

The Israelites kept on giving more and more offerings morning after morning. The workers told Moses: "The people are bringing more than is needed for the construction of the work God commanded to be done."

Moses sent a message to the Israelites in the camp: "Stop your offerings. You have given all that is needed to build the tabernacle for God."

Session 13
Building the Tabernacle
Exodus 35:30–40:38

Moses called the Israelites together. Moses told the people that God had a very important job for them. God wanted the people to make a place for Him, a tabernacle.

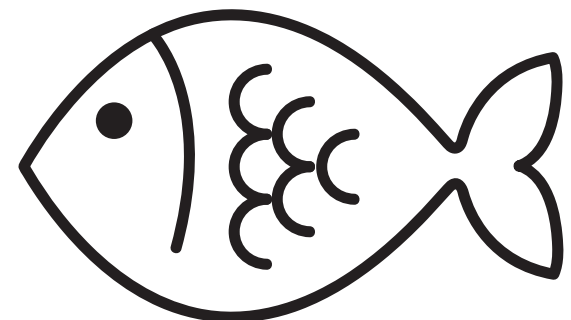
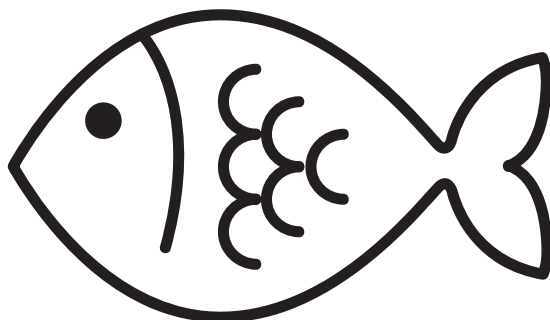
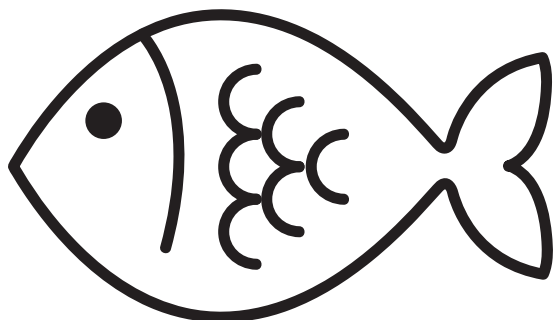
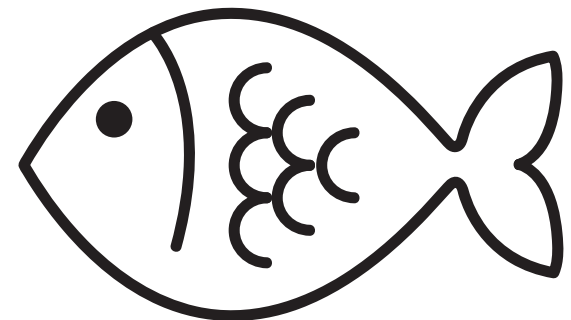
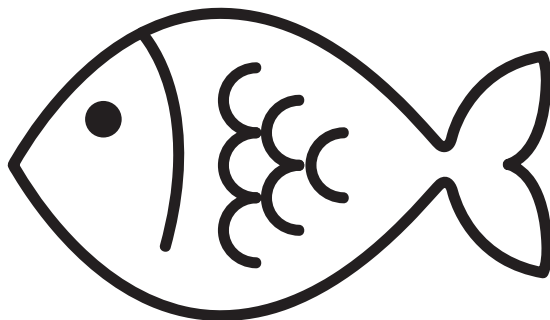
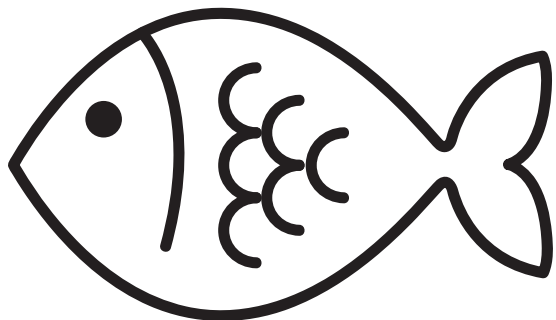
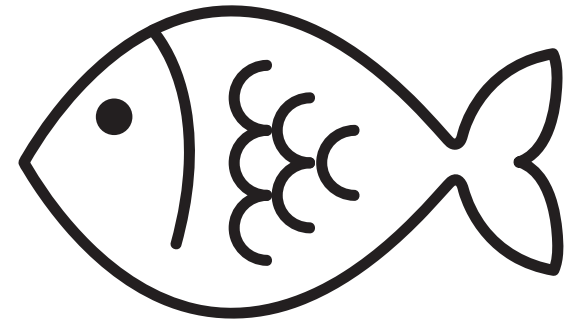
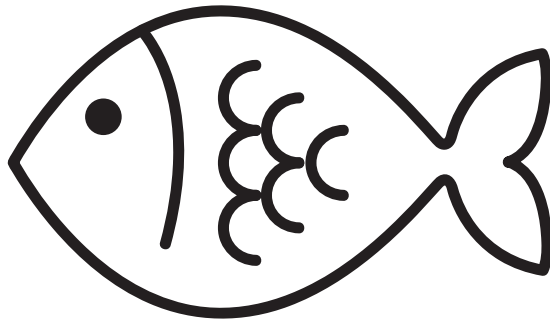
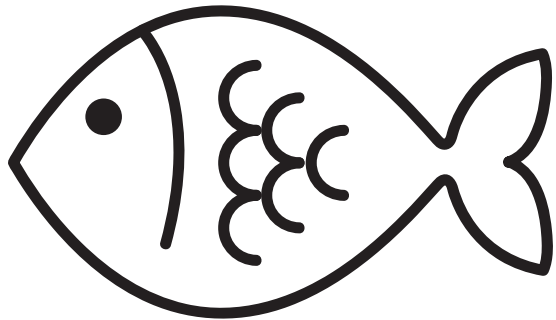
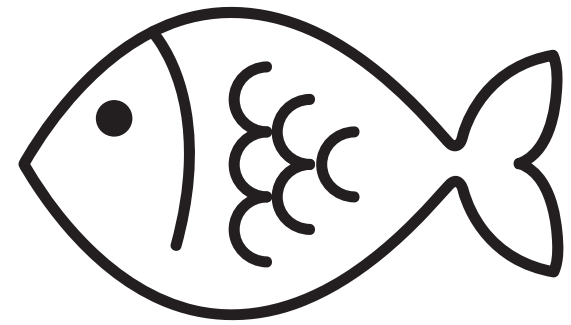
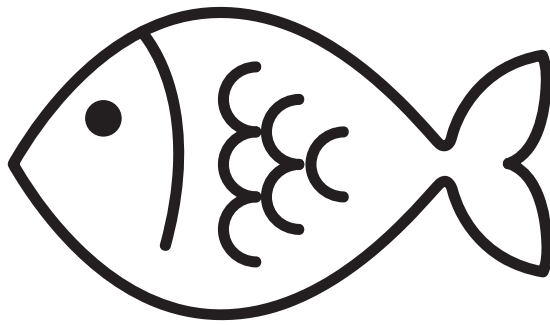
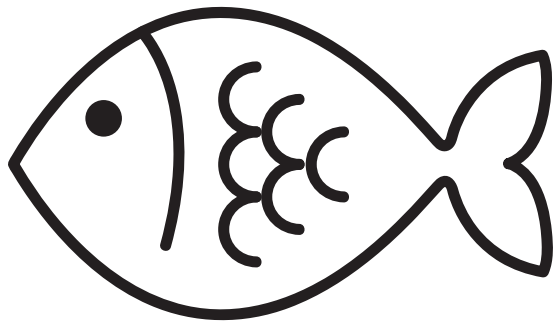
“Everyone who can work should help,” Moses said. Moses told the people to give offerings and bring all the things that would be needed to make the tabernacle.

The people did as Moses said. They gathered all the things that were needed to build the tabernacle. The people took jewelry and ornaments. Some took purple, red, and blue cloth. Others took oils and spices. The people even collected more than was needed.

Skilled workmen were chosen to do the work. Then God told Moses how the people were to build the tabernacle.

The people followed God’s instructions exactly. Some people made blue, purple, and red cloth. Other people sewed the cloth together to make one piece for the tent church. Another group of people built the frame for the tabernacle. Another group of people made a table and covered it with pure gold. People made frames and hooks to hold up the tabernacle. People made special clothes for the priests.

Everyone did his job to build the tabernacle for God. When the tabernacle was finished, Moses inspected all the work. Moses saw that the Israelites had done just as God commanded them.

Brazilian Brigadeiro Recipe

Ingredients:

- 3 14-ounce cans of sweetened condensed milk
- 9 tablespoons of unsweetened cocoa
- 3 tablespoons of butter
- Chocolate sprinkles
- Large saucepan
- Cooking oil
- Optional: Foil candy cups

Recipe:

Pour the condensed milk in a large saucepan over medium heat. Add the cocoa and butter to the milk. Cook while stirring until the mixture thickens in about 10–15 minutes. Remove from the heat source and let it cool in the pan until it can be handled.

Spray the cooking oil lightly on your hands. Using primarily the palm of your hands, form small chocolate balls and place on a serving plate. Roll the balls in the chocolate sprinkles. If desired, place in foil candy cups.

The dessert can be eaten immediately or chilled until serving.

Supplies Needed:

- Printed CD Printable “Map of Brazil” on heavyweight paper (1 page per kid)
- Canning jar rings (1 per kid)
- Permanent markers
- Pens or pencils

- Twine, ribbon, or yarn
- Low temperature glue gun and glue sticks

Procedures:

Distribute a pencil or pen, a copy of the map printable, a canning jar ring, and pair of scissors to each kid. Lead kids to place the canning jar ring over the section of the map they would like to include in their ornaments. Instruct kids to use their pencil or pen to trace the outside of the lid onto the map.

Then guide kids to carefully cut out their circled section of the map.

Tell kids to cut a section of twine, ribbon, or yarn and loop it through the lid ring and tie the ends in a knot to form the hanger for their ornaments.

Allow leaders or older kids to use the glue guns to adhere the map circles to the back of the canning ring. Trim any excess paper around the edge of the ring.

Let kids use the permanent markers to write *Pray* on the map and highlight, circle, or place a heart near the areas of Brazil they want to pray for specifically.

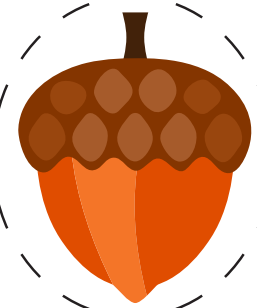
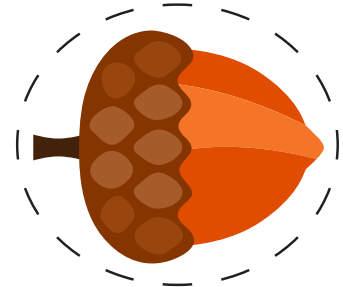
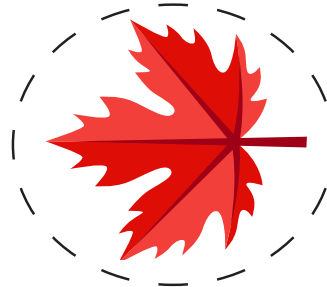
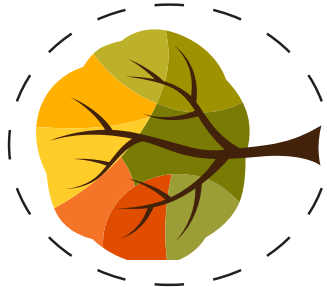
Provide ziplock bags for kids to take their ornaments home as the glue and marker dries.

Supplies Needed:

- Cardstock paper to print enough copies of the bookmarks for all kids to have a bookmark and choice of toppers
- Kid-size safety scissors
- Glue
- Optional: Self-adhesive plastic

Procedures:

Print several copies of these bookmarks on cardstock for kids to assemble the bookmarks with their choice of toppers. For younger kids, cut out the pieces to assemble. Lead kids to choose one or more of the toppers to cut apart and glue to the top of the bookmark strips. For durability, cover the bookmarks with self-adhesive plastic and trim the edges as needed.

- Large diameter swim foam noodle
- Serrated knife or electric knife (for leader's use)
- Needle-nose pliers
- Construction paper
- Markers
- Scissors
- Glue
- Small toy cars
- Optional: Bamboo skewers

Procedures:

Use the serrated knife or electric knife to cut the swim foam noodle in half vertically down the noodle.

Lay both halves down on the ground side by side (inside center facing up).

Insert as many toothpicks as needed into the two halves to hold the two halves together tightly.

Use the needle-nose pliers to clip the ends of the toothpicks to prevent injury and keep the toothpicks from impeding the cars traveling on the track.

Cut triangle-shaped flags from construction paper and glue to toothpicks. Stick the toothpick flags along the track on both sides.

Create a **Start** and **Finish** sign. If desired, cut bamboo skewers down and attach the Start and Finish signs to these "poles" to allow the cars to travel under the signs.

Prop the Start side of the noodle track on a table or chair to allow the cars to travel faster down the track.
