SACRIFICE OF CAIN AND ABEL PLAQUE

What do birds, gold, and bread have in common? They were offerings!

Offerings are **GIFTS GIVEN TO GOD**. Today, we give money. In Bible times, God's people gave many kinds of offerings, like **ANIMALS, CROPS, SPICES, AND LINEN**. The first offerings in the Bible were given by the world's first brothers, Cain and Abel. This ivory plaque shows them giving their offerings. The plaque was made in Italy. Today, it hangs in the **LOUVRE MUSEUM IN PARIS, FRANCE**. This piece of art is more than **900 YEARS OLD!**
