THE GOSPEL

GOD'S PLAN FOR ME

The word *gospel* means "good news."

It is the message about Christ, the kingdom of God, and salvation.



GOD RULES.

The Bible tells us God created everything, including you and me, and He is in charge of everything. Invite a volunteer to recite Genesis 1:1 from memory or read it from his Bible. Read Revelation 4:11 and Colossians 1:16-17.



WE SINNED.

Since the time of Adam and Eve, everyone has chosen to disobey God (Romans 3:23). The Bible calls this sin. Because God is holy, God cannot be around sin. Sin separates us from God and deserves God's punishment of death (Romans 6:23).



GOD PROVIDED.

Read John 3:16 aloud. God sent His Son, Jesus, the perfect solution to our sin problem, to rescue us from the punishment we deserve. It's something we, as sinners, could never earn on our own. Jesus alone saves us. Read Ephesians 2:8-9.



JESUS GIVES.

Jesus lived a perfect life, died on the cross for our sins, and rose again. Because Jesus gave up His life for us, we can be welcomed into God's family for eternity. This is the best gift ever! Read Romans 5:8; 2 Corinthians 5:21; or 1 Peter 3:18.



WE RESPOND.

We can respond to Jesus. "The ABCs of Becoming a Christian" is a simple tool that helps us remember how to respond when prompted by the Holy Spirit to the gift Jesus offers.

ADMIT

Admit to God that you are a sinner. The first people God created chose to sin and disobey God. Ever since then, all people have chosen to sin and disobey (Romans 3:23). Tell God you messed up and you are sorry for doing your own thing and turning away from Him through your thoughts, words, and actions. Repent, turn away from your sin. (Acts 3:19; 1 John 1:9) *Repent* doesn't just mean turning from doing bad things to doing good things. It means turning from sin and even from your own good works and turning to Jesus, trusting only in Him to save you.

BELIEVE

Believe that Jesus is God's Son and receive God's gift of forgiveness from sin. You must believe that only Jesus can save you and you cannot save yourself from your sin problem—not even by praying to God, going to church, or reading your Bible. Your faith or your trust is only in Jesus and what He did for you through His life, death, and resurrection. (Acts 16:31; Acts 4:12; John 14:6; Ephesians 2:8-9)

CONFESS

Confess your faith in Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord. Tell God and tell others what you believe. If Jesus is your Savior, you are trusting only in Him to save you. Jesus is also Lord, which means He is in charge and calling the shots in your life. You can start following Him and doing what He says in the Bible. You are born again into a new life and look forward to being with God forever. (Romans 10:9-10,13)

Mango Sticky Rice

INFORMATION:

Mango sticky rice is a popular traditional Thai dessert. It is made with glutinous rice, fresh mango, and coconut milk. This recipe is an adaptation to make a delicious “quicker” version of this loved dessert for 12 servings.

INGREDIENTS

3 cups raw Thai jasmine rice

3 ¾ cups water

4 ½ cups coconut milk

3 cups granulated sugar

1 ½ teaspoon salt

12 ripe mangoes, peeled, sliced, and divided into 12 portions

Optional: toasted sesame seeds for topping

DIRECTIONS

1. Add the rice and water to a 6-quart pot. Stir once and set it on high heat. Leave uncovered and bring it to a boil. Reduce the heat to the lowest setting. Cover the pot and allow the rice to slowly absorb all the water.
2. When all water has been absorbed, add coconut milk, sugar, and salt to the pot. Stir the mixture and bring to a high boil over medium heat. Allow the mixture to boil hard for 2 minutes, stirring continuously.
3. Remove the pot from the heat. Allow the rice pudding to sit covered and undisturbed for 10 minutes. Stir once and let the rice pudding sit covered for another 10 minutes before serving. The rice pudding can cool completely to room temperature.
4. When ready to serve, divide the rice pudding into 12 servings. Top each serving with one portion of the prepared mangoes. If desired, add the toasted sesame seeds to the top.

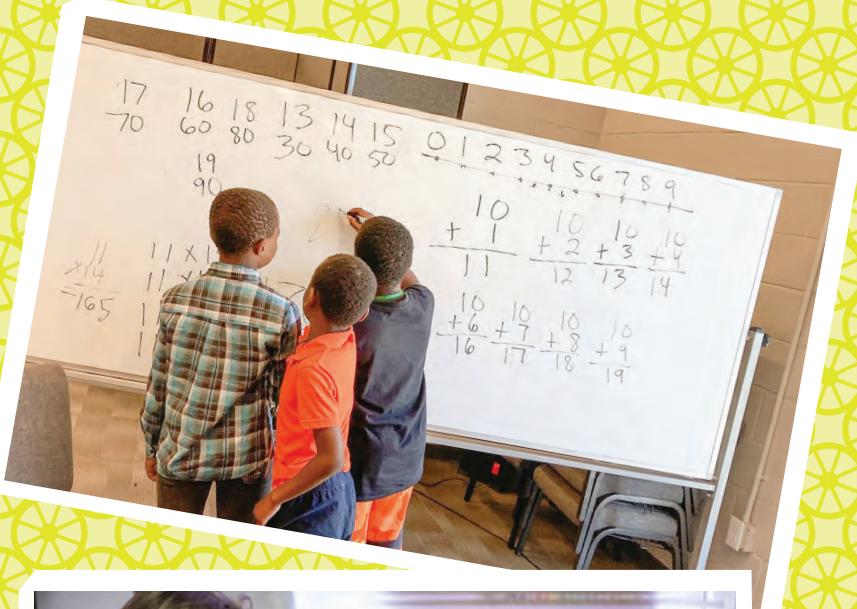

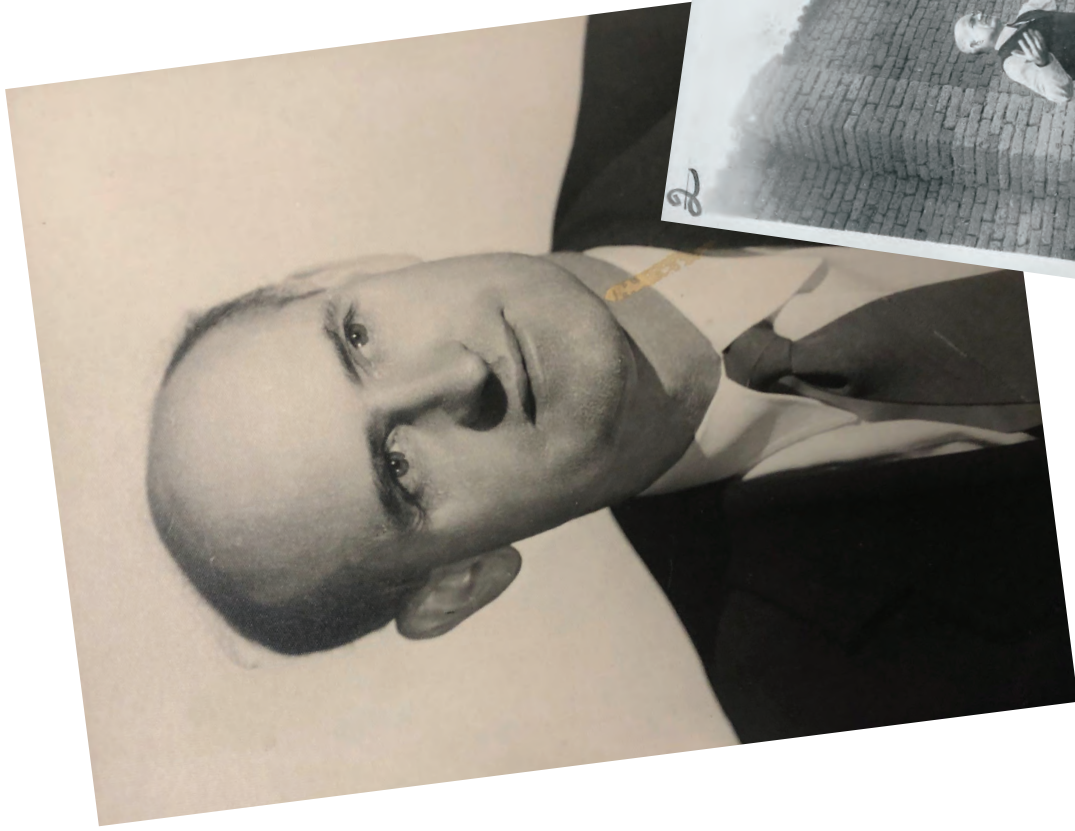

Mexican Fruit Paleta

INGREDIENTS

3 cups of ripe fresh fruit partially chopped up
(Options: cantaloupe, mango, pineapple, strawberries, watermelon)

$\frac{1}{2}$ cup sugar

$\frac{1}{3}$ cup water

ice pop molds or paper cups and craft sticks

DIRECTIONS

1. Place half of the fruit, sugar, and water into a blender. Blend until it reaches a smooth consistency.
2. Cut up the other half of the fruit. Spoon the pieces into the ice pop molds or cups. Add the blended mixture to each mold or cup, leaving approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch space for mixture to expand.
3. Place the molds or cups in the freezer. Allow approximately six hours for mixture to freeze.
4. Note: If you are using cups or molds without built-in sticks for handles, insert the craft sticks into mixture when it is partially frozen and return the treats to the freezer.



ELIJAH ON MOUNT CARMEL

Elijah: "I responded to King Ahab, 'I have not ruined Israel. You and your family have by ignoring the LORD's commands and choosing to worship false gods. Now bring all the people and all the false prophets to Mount Carmel.'"

Elijah: "So Ahab called the people to come to Mount Carmel. I told the people 'Why don't you choose who you want to follow—the false gods or the one true God?' But the people said nothing."

Elijah: "I was the only prophet of the LORD left. The false god, Baal, had 450 prophets. I told them to bring two bulls and to choose one and offer it as a sacrifice to Baal. I would offer the other bull to the LORD, the one true God. However, I told them that we would not light the fire on the sacrifices. They would call on Baal to light their fire. I would call on God to light His sacrifice on fire. Then we would know whose 'god' is the one true God."

Elijah continues: "The people agreed and began to call out to Baal to light their sacrifice on fire. They called from morning until noon. They danced around the altar and called out to Baal some more. But Baal did not answer. I mocked them. 'Maybe your god is sleeping. Shout louder to wake him up.' All afternoon the false prophets called to Baal and there was no answer."

NOTE: BEGIN TO REBUILD THE ALTAR AS YOU TALK USING THE 12 STONES INSIDE THE SWIMMING POOL. PLACE WOOD ON THE ROCKS AND POUR WATER ON IT AS YOU TALK.

Elijah: "I took 12 stones, one for each tribe of Israel, and repaired the altar of God that had been torn down. I dug a trench around the altar and ordered that four water pots be filled and poured over the sacrifice and the wood the sacrifice was on. I ordered the water pots to be filled and poured on the altar three times! Water ran down the altar and filled the trench around it."

Elijah: "Then I prayed: 'God, let everyone understand that you are the one true God of Israel, and I am Your servant and You sent me to do all these things. Answer me, LORD, so the people will see that You are the one true God.'"

Elijah (Look at the group with strong emotion and awe): "Then God sent fire. The fire consumed the burnt offering, the wood, the stones, the dust, and all the water in the trench. When the people saw the fire from God, they fell down and said, 'He is God! The LORD is God!'"

ELIJAH BIBLE STORY SCRIPT

Prop assistant puts out tree.

NARRATOR: "Elijah traveled into the wilderness and sat down under a broom tree."

Elijah sits down under the tree and sighs with frustration and a look of sadness.

ELIJAH: "I have had enough! LORD, take my life."

NARRATOR: "Then Elijah laid down and slept."

Elijah lays down and pretends to sleep.

While Elijah sleeps, prop assistant puts out bread on rocks and a jug of water.

ANGEL touches Elijah and says: "Get up and eat."

NARRATOR: "Elijah saw a loaf of bread baking on hot stones and a jug of water. Elijah ate and drank, then he rested again."

Elijah looks at bread and water. He eats and drinks and then he rests again.

ANGEL touches Elijah and says: "Get up and eat or the journey will be too much for you."

NARRATOR: "Elijah ate and drank. Then Elijah walked for forty days and nights to Mount Horeb. Elijah entered a cave in the mountain and stayed the night."

Elijah acts out eating, drinking, walking, and sleeping for the night.
