THE GOSPEL

GOD'S PLAN FOR ME

The word *gospel* means “good news.”

It is the message about Christ, the kingdom of God, and salvation.



GOD RULES.

The Bible tells us God created everything, including you and me, and He is in charge of everything. Invite a volunteer to recite Genesis 1:1 from memory or read it from his Bible. [READ REVELATION 4:11 AND COLOSSIANS 1:16-17.](#)



WE SINNED.

Since the time of Adam and Eve, everyone has chosen to disobey God ([ROMANS 3:23](#)). The Bible calls this sin. Because God is holy, God cannot be around sin. Sin separates us from God and deserves God's punishment of death ([ROMANS 6:23](#)).



GOD PROVIDED.

Read John 3:16 aloud. God sent His Son, Jesus, the perfect solution to our sin problem, to rescue us from the punishment we deserve. It's something we, as sinners, could never earn on our own. Jesus alone saves us. [READ EPHESIANS 2:8-9.](#)



JESUS GIVES.

Jesus lived a perfect life, died on the cross for our sins, and rose again. Because Jesus gave up His life for us, we can be welcomed into God's family for eternity. This is the best gift ever! [READ ROMANS 5:8; 2 CORINTHIANS 5:21; OR 1 PETER 3:18.](#)



WE RESPOND.

We can respond to Jesus. “The ABCs of Becoming a Christian” is a simple tool that helps us remember how to respond when prompted by the Holy Spirit to the gift Jesus offers.

A DMIT

Admit to God that you are a sinner. The first people God created chose to sin and disobey God. Ever since then, all people have chosen to sin and disobey (Romans 3:23). Tell God you messed up and you are sorry for doing your own thing and turning away from Him through your thoughts, words, and actions. Repent, turn away from your sin. (Acts 3:19; 1 John 1:9) Repent doesn't just mean turning from doing bad things to doing good things. It means turning from sin and even from your own good works and turning to Jesus, trusting only in Him to save you.

B ELIEVE

Believe that Jesus is God's Son and receive God's gift of forgiveness from sin. You must believe that only Jesus can save you and you cannot save yourself from your sin problem—not even by praying to God, going to church, or reading your Bible. Your faith or your trust is only in Jesus and what He did for you through His life, death, and resurrection. (Acts 16:31; Acts 4:12; John 14:6; Ephesians 2:8-9)

C ONFESS

Confess your faith in Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord. Tell God and tell others what you believe. If Jesus is your Savior, you are trusting only in Him to save you. Jesus is also Lord, which means He is in charge and calling the shots in your life. You can start following Him and doing what He says in the Bible. You are born again into a new life and look forward to being with God forever. (Romans 10:9-10,13)



WEEKLY BONUS VERSES

SESSION 1: DEUTERONOMY 31:8

The Lord is the one who will go before you. He will be with you; he will not leave you or abandon you. Do not be afraid or discouraged. (Deuteronomy 31:8, CSB)

SESSION 3: JOSHUA 22:5

Only carefully obey the command and instruction that Moses the Lord's servant gave you: to love the Lord your God, walk in all his ways, keep his commands, be loyal to him, and serve him with all your heart and all your soul. (Joshua 22:5, CSB)

But be very careful to keep the commandment and the law that Moses the servant of the Lord gave you: to love the Lord your God, to walk in obedience to him, to keep his commands, to hold fast to him and to serve him with all your heart and with all your soul. (Joshua 22:5, NIV)

SESSION 4: EXODUS 25:8

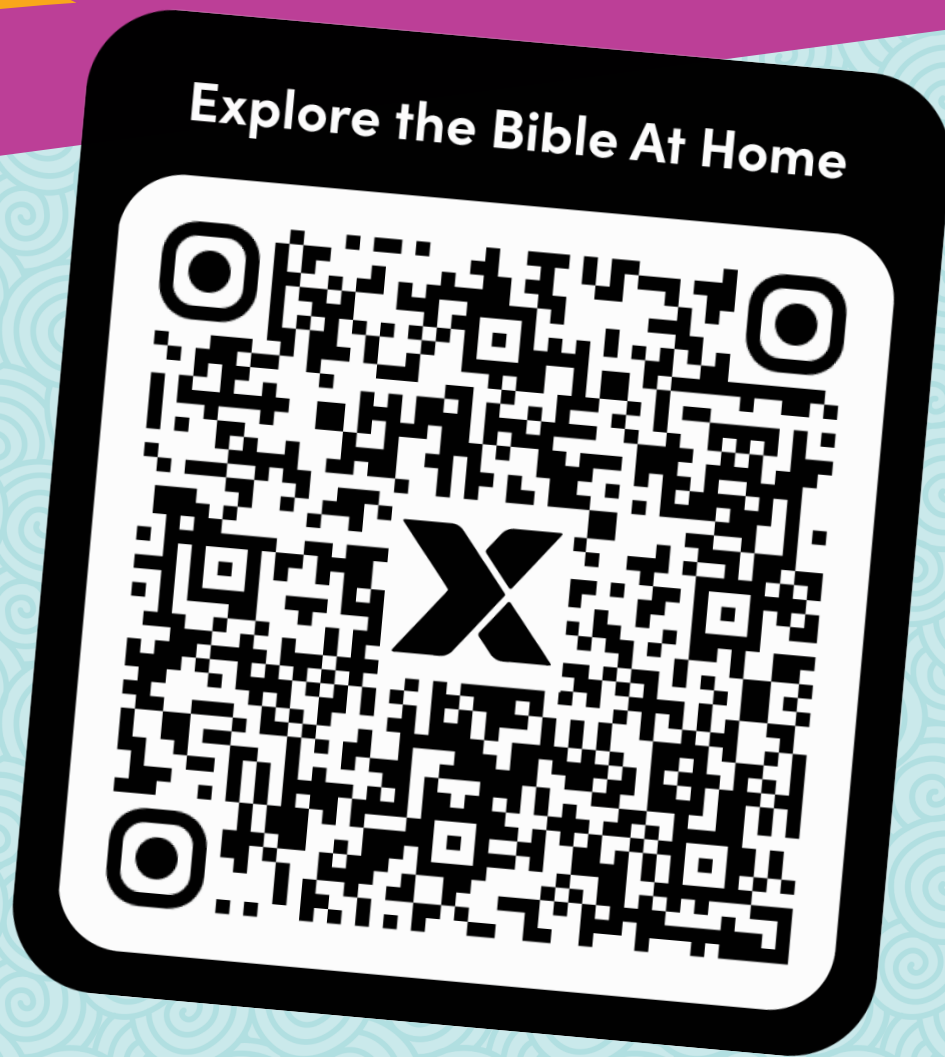

The Bible tells about a man named Moses. Moses was a great leader who helped God's people escape from Egypt, where they were slaves. God's plan for Moses began with his birth. This is Moses' story.

A baby boy was born to a Hebrew family who lived in Egypt. He was a beautiful baby and his family loved him.

But the king in Egypt did not like the Hebrews and he wanted to be rid of them.

The baby's mother knew this. She loved her son and made a way to keep her Hebrew baby safe from the king. At just the right time, the mother put her baby in a basket. She set the basket near the place where the king's daughter bathed by the river.

When the king's daughter saw the baby, she felt sad. She knew her father, the king, did not like Hebrew boys.

The baby's older sister, Miriam, watched from a distance. Then Miriam spoke to the king's daughter, "Should I get a Hebrew woman to care for the baby?"

God told Moses and the Hebrews to travel toward the sea. On the way, the people camped at the edge of the wilderness. God did not want the people to change their minds, so God told Moses to lead the people a different way around the sea along the road of the wilderness.

Pharaoh decided he did not want the Hebrews to leave and stop being his slaves. Pharaoh sent his soldiers to find the people and bring them back to Egypt. The soldiers discovered the Hebrews camping by the sea.

When the Hebrews saw Pharaoh's army coming after them, the people were terrified! They went to Moses and cried out to God to help them.

Moses told the people to stand strong and not be afraid. God would fight for them and rescue them from Pharaoh's army.

And that is what God did! God pushed back the water in the sea so the Hebrews could walk on dry ground to the other side. When everyone was safely across, God caused the waters to flow back into the sea. Pharaoh's army drowned in the water, and God's people were safe.

God had rescued His people! The Israelites saw God's great power and strength.

SESSION 3

God Gave the Law

Exodus 19:1-25; 20:1-17; Leviticus 19:1-4

Moses was camped in the desert with the people of Israel. Moses was leading the people to a special land God had promised to give the people after they left Egypt.

One day God told Moses to leave the camp and walk up a mountain. God wanted to talk to Moses.

God said, “Moses, tell the people to obey Me. Tell them to keep My commandments and I will make them a special people.” God told Moses that God had chosen the Israelites to be God’s own people.

God gave Moses important commandments for the people to obey. The commandments would help the people know how to treat one another and love God as they should. God said that if the people would do what He said, God would remember them always and they would be His special people forever.

Moses went back down the mountain. He told the people what God said.

The people listened. Moses told the people God’s commandments. Some of the commandments were: Love Me. I am your God. Love your mother and father and do what they tell you to do. Do not take and keep anything that belongs to someone else. Always tell the truth.

The people said, “We will do everything God said.”

God loved the people. He gave the commandments to the people so they would know how to obey God and please Him.

SESSION 4

The Tabernacle

Exodus 35–40

Moses called the people together. He told them that God had a very important job for them. God wanted the people to make a place for Him, a tabernacle (tent church). The tabernacle would be a place where the people worshiped God and praised Him.

“Everyone who can work should help,” Moses said. Moses told the people to give offerings and bring all the things that would be needed to make the tabernacle.

The people did as Moses said. They gathered all the things that were needed to build the tabernacle. The people gave jewelry and ornaments. Some gave purple, red, and blue cloth. Others gave oils and spices. The people even collected more than was needed. Moses said, “Stop. We do not need any more things for the tabernacle.”

Then God told Moses how the people were to build the tabernacle. Moses gave the instructions to the people who would build the tabernacle.

The people did everything exactly as God said. Some people made blue, purple, and red cloth. Other people sewed the cloth together to make one piece for the tent church. Another group of people built the frame for the tabernacle. Another group of people made a table and covered it with pure gold. People made frames and hooks to hold up the tabernacle. People made special clothes for the church leaders.

Everyone did his job to build the tabernacle for God.

SESSION 5

The Triumphal Entry

Matthew 21:1-17

Jesus and His disciples were walking toward Jerusalem. They stopped at the Mount of Olives.

“Go into the village,” Jesus told two disciples. “You will see a donkey and a colt. Untie the animals and bring them to Me. If anyone says anything, tell him I need the animals. The person will agree to let you take them.”

The disciples did just as Jesus said. They found the donkey in the street, tied by a door. The disciples took the animals to Jesus, then the disciples laid their robes on the animals’ backs.

Jesus sat on the robes. Then Jesus began riding into the city. As Jesus neared Jerusalem, He saw people crowding the street and the gate. The people were excited!

Many people began to spread their robes on the road, and others spread leafy branches they cut from trees. The people made a path for the donkeys to walk on. The people went in front of Jesus as He rode the animals into Jerusalem.

The crowds shouted praises to Jesus, “Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna!”

When Jesus entered Jerusalem, the whole city was surprised. The crowds of people kept saying, “This is Jesus! This is the prophet Jesus from Nazareth.”

SESSION 6

Jesus' Death and Resurrection

Matthew 26:36-68; 27:1-2,11-65; 28:1-8

Many people were angry with Jesus. They wanted to be rid of Him. The people hurt Jesus, made fun of Him, called Him names, and said hurtful things to Jesus.

The people made Jesus get on the cross. They said, "If You are God's Son, save Yourself."

But Jesus knew this was how the people would treat Him. And Jesus knew this was God's plan.

Later that day, Jesus died on the cross. His friends were sad. They did not know what to do.

But three days later, everyone was surprised. Early in the morning Jesus' friends Mary Magdalene and Mary went to the tomb where Jesus' body had been placed. The women carried special spices with them.

When the women arrived at the garden where the tomb was, they saw something strange. The stone that had been put in the door of the tomb had been rolled away!

Then Mary Magdalene and Mary saw a man sitting near the stone. The man was wearing bright clothes. The man was an angel.

"Don't be afraid," the angel said. "I know you are looking for Jesus. Come and look where His body was placed. He is not here. He is alive! Now go and tell Jesus' disciples that Jesus is alive!"

The women remembered that Jesus had told them about these things. They hurried to find the disciples and tell them the good news.

Romans 8:1-17; Galatians 5:16-26

Paul wrote a letter to church people in Rome. Paul had not met these people, but he knew about them. The church people in Rome had helped many people hear the good news about Jesus. Paul thanked the church people in Rome for their work.

Paul wanted the people in Rome to be sure of God's power and love. In his letter, Paul said that everyone who loves God and believes in Jesus will have hard times, but God is always there to help. "Nothing and no one has the power to separate you from God. You are God's children, and He is your father," Paul said.

Paul told the church people not to be afraid or worried. Paul explained that God has a plan, and it is perfect. Everything that happens is part of God's plan. And good things always come out of God's plan.

Paul loved the church people, and he wanted them to know that God was always with them and provided for them.

Paul helped the people in Rome know how God wanted them to live. "If God is for us, who can be against us? No one!" exclaimed Paul. "We can do everything because God is always with us."

You must pray to God and know that Jesus will help you. Think about the people who don't know Jesus. Help them."

Jude reminded the people that God was able to protect the people and keep them strong. Jude said, "Keep yourselves in the love of God."
